- 9 Section 1. Title 42 is amended by adding a section to read: 10 § 8340.3. Rescue from motor vehicle.
- 11 (a) (Reserved).
 - (b) Rescue of animal. -- No law enforcement officer, humane society police officer or emergency responder, or the employer of a law enforcement officer, humane society police officer or emergency responder shall be liable for damage to a motor vehicle or the contents thereof caused by entry into the motor vehicle for the purpose of removing an animal, if the law
- 17 enforcement officer, humane society police officer or emergency 18 19 responder:
 - (1) Has a good faith, reasonable belief that the animal is in imminent danger of suffering harm if not immediately removed from the motor vehicle.
 - (2) Makes a reasonable effort to locate the driver of the motor vehicle prior to entry.
 - (3) Takes reasonable steps to ensure or restore the well-being of the animal.
 - (4) Uses no more force than necessary under the circumstances to enter the motor vehicle.
- 29 (5) Leaves notice on or in the motor vehicle stating the reason entry was made, the name of the person and of the 30 31 person's employer, a telephone number and, if possible, the location where the animal may be retrieved. 32
