The options may include, 13 14 but shall not be limited to: 15 * * * 16 (3) Other programs, activities or learning experiences taken 17 for credit or hourly, to include: (i) curriculum development and other program design and 18 19 delivery activities at the school entity or grade level as determined by the school entity and approved by the board of 20 21 directors; 22 (ii) participation in professional conferences and 23 workshops; 24 (iii) education in the workplace, where the work relates to 25 the professional educator's area of assignment and is approved by the board of directors; 26 (iv) review, redesign and restructuring of school programs, 27 organizations and functions as determined by the school entity 28 29 and approved by the board of directors; 30 (v) in-service programs that comply with guidelines established by the department; 31 32 early childhood and child development activities for (vi) 33 professional educators whose area of assignment includes 34 kindergarten through third grade; 35 (vii) special education activities for professional 36 educators whose area of assignment includes students with 37 special needs;

1 (viii) successful completion of department training for service as a Distinguished Educator if the professional educator 2 3 participates in and completes at least one assignment in the Distinguished Educators Program; 4 (ix) other continuing professional education courses, 5 6 programs, activities or learning experiences sponsored by the 7 department; [or] (x) visits by educators to a manufacturing workplace for 8 9 orientation and demonstrations to give the professional educator a greater understanding of job opportunities in manufacturing 10 11 for students[.]; or 12 (xi) access to the Advanced Placement Course for All St<u>udents program.</u> 13 * * * 14 15 Section 6. The act is amended by adding an article to read: 16 ARTICLE XVII-D ACCESS TO ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES 17 18 FOR ALL STUDENTS 19 <u>Section 1701-D. Scope of article.</u> 20 This article relates to access to advanced placement courses_ for all students. 21 <u>Section 1702-D. Definitions.</u> 22 The following words and phrases when used in this article 23 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 24 25 context clearly indicates otherwise: "Advanced placement course." A high school-level preparatory 26 course for a college advanced placement test that: 27 28 (1) incorporates all topics specified by the college 29 board on its standards syllabus for a given subject area; and 30 (2) is authorized by the college board. 31 "Department." The Department of Education of the 32 Commonwealth. 33 "Eligible teacher." A professional employee that is certified in the subject area of the advanced placement course_ 34 that the teacher will be teaching. 35 "Four core academic areas." Advanced placement courses in 36 37 mathematics, English language arts, science and social science. "Poverty level." The percentage of students in a school 38 district eligible for free or reduced price lunch. 39 "Program." The Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program. 40 41 "School entity." Any public school district, intermediate unit, area vocational-technical school, charter school or cyber 42 charter school. 43 44 "Teacher training entities." Institutions of higher education, intermediate units or organizations endorsed by the 45 college board to train teachers to teach advanced placement 46 <u>courses.</u> 47 "Virtual learning instruction." Providing academic courses 48 49 to students via the Internet and the use of technology in providing instruction to students. 50 Section 1703-D. Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program. 51

1	(a) PurposeThe purpose of the Advanced Placement Teacher
2	Training Program is to provide access to advanced placement
3	<u>courses in the four core academic areas for all students by</u>
4	training teachers in advanced placement course instruction at
5	all high schools that do not presently provide advanced
6	placement courses in one or more of these disciplines. The
7	importance of providing access to advanced placement courses for
8	all students is evident in the fact that the Pennsylvania School
9	Performance Profiles established in 2012 include advanced
10	placement participation and performance of a high school as an
11	indicator of academic achievement that determines a high
12	school's academic performance score.
13	(b) EstablishmentBeginning in the 2016-2017 school year,
14	the Advanced Placement Teacher Training Program shall be
15	established in the department to train teachers in eligible
16	school entities to teach advanced placement courses in the four
17	core academic areas.
18	(c) Eligible school entitiesEligible school entities are
19	those that do not have in each of their high schools at least
20	one advanced placement course in the four core academic areas or
21	will no longer have an advanced placement course in one of the
22	four core academic areas due to the retirement or loss of a
23	teacher who teaches an advanced placement course.
24	(1) A school entity that has an advanced placement
25	course in one or more of the four core academic areas but not
26	in all four core academic areas is only eligible to have a
27	teacher trained in those core academic areas in which the
28	school entity does not have an advanced placement course.
29	(2) No more than one teacher per core academic area in
30	each high school of an eligible school entity shall be
31	trained under this program.
32	(3) More than one eligible school entity may apply
33	jointly to the program to train a teacher in advanced
34	placement course instruction if that teacher is to provide
35	such instruction in more than one school entity either
36	through classroom instruction or through virtual learning
37	instruction.
38	(d) Application requirements for eligible school entities
39	The application by an eligible school entity seeking funding for
40	the program shall include the following:
41	(1) The subject areas that currently have advanced
42	placement courses in each of the school entity's high
43	<u>schools.</u>
44	(2) The subject areas among the four core academic areas
45	that the school entity does not have an advanced placement
46	course in each of the school entity's high schools.
47	(3) The names of the eligible teachers, including:
48	(i) the high schools where they are teaching;
49	(ii) the advanced placement academic subject area
50	that each of the teachers will be providing instruction;
51	and

1	(iii) whether the instruction will be in a
2	classroom, through virtual learning instruction, or both.
3	(4) The names of the eligible teacher training entities
4	that shall be providing the training for teachers in advanced
5	placement instruction.
6	(5) Agreement to offer the advanced placement course for
7	high school students for at least three years.
8	(6) Guidelines the school entity will use in determining
9	which students may be eligible to enroll in an advanced
10	placement course. In developing the guidelines, a school
11	entity shall utilize data and information on the academic
12	performance of students, which may include the academic
13	performance of students on the Pre-Scholastic Aptitude Test
14	and the Scholastic Aptitude Test in consultation with the
15	college board, and shall eliminate barriers that restrict
16	access to advanced placement courses for student populations
17	that have been traditionally underserved and shall make every
18	effort to ensure that advanced placement classes reflect the
19	diversity of the student population. The school entity shall
20	not discriminate on any basis in enrollment of the students
21	that is illegal under Federal or State law.
22	(7) Any school entity offering advanced placement
23	courses to students must publish on the school's publicly
24	accessible Internet website the advanced placement courses
25	offered and notify parents of the availability and
26	guidelines.
27	(8) Agreement to annually report to the department for
28	each of the four core academic areas that were taught by
29	teachers whose training was funded by this program. The
30	agreement shall include the following information:
31	(i) the number of students taking advanced placement
32	<u>courses;</u>
33	(ii) the grade levels where advanced placement is
34	being taught;
35	(iii) the number of students who took advanced
36	placement examinations; and
37	(iv) the number of students scoring a three or
38	<u>higher on advanced placement examinations.</u>
39	(9) Agreement to annually report to the department for
40	<u>each of the four core academic areas the following</u>
41	information:
42	(i) the number of students taking advanced placement
43	<u>courses;</u>
44	(ii) the grade levels where advanced placement is
45	being taught;
46	(iii) the number of students who took advanced
47	placement examinations;
48	(iv) the number of students scoring a three or
49	higher on advanced placement examinations; and
50	(v) the number of teachers teaching advanced
51	placement courses.

1	<u>Section 1704-D. Powers and duties of department.</u>
2	<u>(a) GuidelinesThe department shall promulgate rules,</u>
3	regulations and procedures necessary for the implementation of
4	this article, including the following:
5	(1) In consultation with the college board, certify
6	those teacher training entities that are endorsed by the
7	<u>college board to provide training of teachers to teach</u>
8	advanced placement courses in the four core academic areas.
9	(2) In certifying teacher training entities for this
10	program, the department shall ensure that the training times
11	and locations will be geographically accessible for teachers
12	from eligible school entities to attend.
13	(3) The department, in consultation with the college
14	board, shall ensure that training provided by teacher
15	training entities must provide teachers of advanced placement_
16	courses with the necessary content knowledge and
17	instructional skills to prepare students for success in
18	advanced placement courses and examinations.
19	(4) Starting at the end of the first year of the program
20	and every year thereafter the department shall issue a report
21	to the General Assembly on the program that shall include:
22	(i) The number of teachers receiving training in
23	advanced placement instruction in school entities, school
24	districts and high schools in each of the four core
25	academic areas.
26	(ii) The number and percentage of high schools that
27	offer advanced placement courses in all four core
28	academic areas.
29	(iii) The number and percentage of high schools that
30	offer advanced placement courses in each of the four core
31	academic areas.
32	(iv) The number and percentage of students taking
33	<u>advanced placement courses at school entities in each of</u>
34	the four core academic areas.
35	(v) The number and percentage of students scoring a
36	three or more on an advanced placement examination at
37	school entities in each of the four core academic areas.
38	(vi) The names of school entities and high schools
39	<u>that do not offer advanced placement courses.</u>
40	(vii) The number of teachers trained outside the
41	four core academic areas teaching other advanced
42	placement courses.
43	(b) (Reserved).
44	<u>Section 1705-D. Funding to teacher training entities.</u>
45	To the extent funds are appropriated for this program, the
46	department shall allocate the funds based on per teacher
47	attendance to each certified teacher training entity that
48	provides training to a teacher to teach advanced placement
49	courses upon completion of the training program.
50	<u>Section 1706-D. Program funding.</u>
51	(a) FundingFunding for this program shall be made from

(b) Funding prioritiesIn the event that insufficient moneys are appropriated in any fiscal year to provide funding for all eligible school entities applying to the program, the department shall prioritize funding of eligible school entities based on the poverty level of the school districts in which high school students who will be taking the advanced placement courses reside.
