A RESOLUTION

- 1 Requesting that the Consumer Affairs Committee of the House of
- 2 Representatives study and investigate the possibility of
- 3 requiring smoke detectors in all public buildings,
- 4 particularly dormitories having sleeping areas.
- 5 WHEREAS, Over the last 20 years, the Commonwealth has had an
- 6 average of 300 fire deaths per year; and
- WHEREAS, Fires represent a significant threat to public
- 8 property and revenues; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Studies indicate that approximately 50% of
- 10 individual homeowners have seen the value of including smoke
- 11 detectors in their homes; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 1982 there was a 25% decrease in fire-related
- 13 deaths in Pennsylvania; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's State educational system
- 15 represents one of Pennsylvania's most valuable asset; therefore
- 16 be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Consumer Affairs Committee of the House of
- 18 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania initiate an

- investigation into the possibility of requiring smoke detectors 1
- in all public buildings, particularly dormitories having 2
- sleeping areas; and be it further 3
- 4 RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings and
- recommendations to the House of Representatives upon the 5
- 6 completion of its study.
