AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Cancer Drug Repository Program for accepting 2 donated cancer drugs and dispensing cancer drugs.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Cancer Drug
- 7 Repository Program Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Board." The State Board of Pharmacy.
- "Cancer drug." A prescription drug used to treat any of the
- 14 following:
- 15 (1) Cancer or its side effects.

- 1 (2) The side effects of a prescription drug used to
- 2 treat cancer or its side effects.
- 3 "Health care facility." A for-profit or nonprofit entity
- 4 providing clinically related health services, including those
- 5 operated by the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions and
- 6 including a general or special hospital, including psychiatric
- 7 hospitals, rehabilitation hospitals, ambulatory surgical
- 8 facilities, long-term care nursing facilities, a hospice, cancer
- 9 treatment center using radiation therapy on an ambulatory basis
- 10 and inpatient drug and alcohol treatment facility.
- 11 "Health clinic." A for-profit or nonprofit clinic providing
- 12 health services.
- "Hospital." An entity licensed as a hospital under:
- 14 (1) the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as
- 15 the Public Welfare Code; or
- 16 (2) the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as
- 17 the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 18 "Pharmacy." A pharmacy licensed by the Commonwealth.
- 19 "Physician's office." The office of a person licensed to
- 20 practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine and
- 21 surgery.
- 22 "Prescribing practitioner." A health care practitioner
- 23 licensed under the laws of this Commonwealth who is authorized
- 24 to prescribe cancer drugs.
- 25 "Prescription drug." All drugs requiring a prescription in
- 26 this Commonwealth.
- 27 "Program." The Cancer Drug Repository Program established in
- 28 section 3.
- 29 Section 3. Establishment.
- The board shall establish a Cancer Drug Repository Program

- 1 for accepting donated cancer drugs and dispensing cancer drugs
- 2 to residents of this Commonwealth. Participation in the program
- 3 shall be voluntary.
- 4 Section 4. Donation of cancer drugs.
- 5 Any person or entity, including, but not limited to, a cancer
- 6 drug manufacturer or health care facility, may donate cancer
- 7 drugs to the program. Cancer drugs may be donated at a
- 8 physician's office, pharmacy, hospital or health clinic that
- 9 elects to participate in the program and meets the criteria
- 10 established by the board for participation.
- 11 Section 5. Acceptance and dispensation of cancer drugs.
- 12 (1) A cancer drug shall only be accepted or dispensed
- under the program if the drug is in its original unopened,
- 14 sealed and tamper-evident unit dose packaging. A cancer drug
- packaged in single-unit doses may be accepted and dispensed
- if the outside packaging is opened but the single-unit-dose
- 17 packaging is unopened.
- 18 (2) A cancer drug shall not be accepted or dispensed
- 19 under the program if the drug bears an expiration date that
- 20 is earlier than six months after the date the drug was
- 21 donated or the drug is adulterated or misbranded.
- 22 (3) Except as provided in this subsection, unused cancer
- 23 drugs dispensed under a State medical assistance program may
- be accepted and dispensed under the program.
- 25 Section 6. Storage, distribution and fees.
- 26 (1) A physician's office, pharmacy, hospital or health
- 27 clinic that accepts donated cancer drugs under the program
- shall comply with all applicable provisions of Federal and
- 29 State law relating to the storage, distribution and
- 30 dispensing of cancer drugs and shall inspect all cancer drugs

- 1 prior to dispensing to determine if they are adulterated or
- 2 misbranded. The drugs shall only be dispensed pursuant to a
- 3 prescription issued by a prescribing practitioner. The drugs
- 4 may be distributed to another participating physician's
- office, pharmacy, hospital or health clinic for dispensing.
- 6 (2) A physician's office, pharmacy, hospital or health
- 7 clinic may charge a handling fee for distributing or
- 8 dispensing cancer drugs under the program. The fee shall be
- 9 established in regulations promulgated by the board. Cancer
- drugs donated under the program shall not be resold.
- 11 Section 7. Immunity.
- 12 (1) Any person or entity, including a cancer drug
- manufacturer, which exercises reasonable care in donating,
- 14 accepting, distributing or dispensing cancer drugs under the
- program shall be immune from civil or criminal liability or
- 16 professional disciplinary action for any injury, death or
- loss to a person or property relating to such activities.
- 18 (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the donation of a
- 19 cancer drug by a cancer drug manufacturer shall not:
- 20 (i) Absolve the manufacturer of any criminal or
- 21 civil liability that would have existed except for the
- donation.
- 23 (ii) Increase the liability of the cancer drug
- 24 manufacturer that would have existed except for the
- donation.
- 26 Section 8. Regulations.
- 27 The board shall promulgate regulations to carry out the
- 28 purposes of this act within 90 days of the effective date of
- 29 this act. The regulations shall include:
- 30 (1) Eligibility criteria and other standards and

- 1 procedures for physician's offices, pharmacies, pharmacists,
- 2 hospitals and health clinics that accept and distribute or
- 3 dispense donated cancer drugs.
- 4 (2) Necessary forms for administration of the program,
- 5 including forms for use by persons or entities that donate
- 6 cancer drugs under the program.
- 7 (3) The maximum handling fee that may be charged by
- 8 physician's offices, pharmacies, hospitals or health clinics
- 9 that accept and distribute or dispense donated cancer drugs.
- 10 (4) Categories of cancer drugs that the program will
- 11 accept for dispensing and categories of cancer drugs that the
- 12 program will not accept for dispensing and the reason that
- the drugs will not be accepted.
- 14 Section 25. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
