### A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing Congress to extend the provisions of section 127  
2 of the United States Tax Code.

3 WHEREAS, Until January 1, 1984, section 127 of the United  
4 States Tax Code authorized employers who offered educational  
5 programs for their employees to deduct the cost of these  
6 programs from the gross income of the employee so that the  
7 employee did not have to pay income tax on the cost of the  
8 programs; and

9 WHEREAS, This tax incentive enabled employees to take  
10 advantage of these educational programs in order to better  
11 themselves in today's world. It also benefited the employers by  
12 being able to deduct the cost of the programs; and

13 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of  
14 Pennsylvania would like Congress to extend this worthwhile

1 program; therefore be it

2       RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the  
3 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania memorialize Congress to extend the  
4 provisions of section 127 of the United States Tax Code for an  
5 additional five years; and be it further

6       RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to  
7 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each  
8 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
