A RESOLUTION

1 Designating April 10, 2002, as "2002 Pennsylvania Sleep Apnea 2 Awareness Day." 3 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth is proud to join Awake in Philly 4 Community Education Group as it organizes the second annual 5 "Pennsylvania Sleep Apnea Awareness Day" on April 10, 2002; and 6 WHEREAS, An estimated 712,899 Pennsylvanians suffer from 7 sleep apnea, a serious, potentially life-threatening breathing 8 disorder that can be treated in most cases; and 9 WHEREAS, Untreated, sleep apnea leads to depression, sexual 10 dysfunction and hypertension as well as an increased risk for 11 heart attack, stroke and automobile accidents; and 12 WHEREAS, Sleep apnea can be successfully treated without 13 surgery or other invasive action; and 14 WHEREAS, Through intervention and diagnosis, overall health 15 care costs in this Commonwealth may be reduced; and 16 WHEREAS, Awake in Philly is working to have the insurance 17 industry recognize that coverage for sleep medicine, including

sleep studies, positive airway pressure devices and other
 related supplies could help reduce overall health care costs and
 improve the general health of the insured; and

WHEREAS, Numerous studies have concluded that the public,
policymakers and primary care physicians lack basic sleep
knowledge; and

7 WHEREAS, Medical students receive an average of two hours of 8 instruction in basic sleep science, covering more than 80 9 classified sleep disorders; and

WHEREAS, The societal and economic costs of untreated and undiagnosed sleep disorders, including sleep apnea and chronic sleepiness, are devastating: sleep deprivation and untreated sleep disorders are estimated to cost Americans over \$100 billion annually in lost productivity, medical expenses, sick leave and property and environmental damage; and

16 WHEREAS, The Department of Transportation estimates that the 17 1997 economic impact loss due to traffic accidents was \$987 for 18 every person in this Commonwealth; and

19 WHEREAS, Organizers of the "2002 Pennsylvania Sleep Apnea 20 Awareness Day" are committed to educating business, government 21 and the public on the impact of untreated and undiagnosed sleep 22 disorders; and

23 WHEREAS, During "2002 Pennsylvania Sleep Apnea Awareness 24 Day," Awake in Philly and other organizations are sharing 25 information at events in malls and other locations throughout 26 this Commonwealth; therefore be it

27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April
28 10, 2002, as "2002 Pennsylvania Sleep Apnea Awareness Day."
