## A RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5	Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to study and evaluate this Commonwealth's vulnerabilities regarding its transportation infrastructure to protect the public safety needs in the event of a natural disaster, a terror attack or a hazardous materials incident.
6	WHEREAS, The House of Representatives recognizes the need to
7	provide safety and security to residents of this Commonwealth in
8	the preparedness, prevention and response to terror attacks,
9	natural disasters and hazardous materials incidents; and
10	WHEREAS, In the case of a disaster, the responsiveness of
11	Pennsylvania's local officials and first responders and
12	transportation employees will be of the utmost importance;
13	therefore be it
14	RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
15	Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a study to
16	review and evaluate the following:
17	(1) The ability of local governments to respond to this
18	Commonwealth's needs in the event of a terror attack, natural
19	disaster or hazardous materials incident.

1 (2) The safety and security of the cargo imported into 2 this Commonwealth, including the distribution chain of 3 freight from ports to trucking to railroads and backup 4 systems required to ensure continuous operation of critical 5 elements in the event of an incident;

6 and be it further

7 RESOLVED, That the study include, in addition, a separate 8 assessment for freight and intercity passenger rail 9 transportation and a prioritized recommendation for:

10 (1) Improving the security of rail infrastructure and 11 facilities, terminals, tunnels, rail bridges, rail switching 12 areas and other areas as posing significant rail-related 13 risks to public safety and the movement of interstate 14 commerce, taking into account the impact that any proposed 15 security measure might have on the provision of rail service.

16 (2) Training railroad employees in terrorism response
17 activities, including provision of protective clothing,
18 participation in exercises with county or regional task
19 forces and deploying chemical and biological weapons
20 detection equipment.

(3) Passenger and cargo security protection systems,
 including, but not limited to, passenger and cargo screening,
 procedural policies, communication systems and emergency
 response planning;

26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the 27 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a 28 transportation infrastructure vulnerability assessment to 29 evaluate this Commonwealth's preparedness to meet safety and 30 security needs of the public in the event of a natural disaster, 20060H0558R3432 - 2 - terror attack or hazardous materials incident; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee make a report of its findings and recommendations to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and to the Professional Licensure Committee within six months of the adoption of this resolution and issue interim reports to the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Professional Licensure Committee as it deems necessary.
