A RESOLUTION

1 Designating the month of May 2006 as "Stroke Awareness Month" in
2 Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, Every 45 seconds someone in the United States
4 experiences a stroke; and

5 WHEREAS, Stroke is the third leading cause of death in
6 America, killing an estimated 275,000 people annually, and a
7 leading cause of adult disability; and

8 WHEREAS, There are more than 4.7 million stroke survivors in
9 the United States, two-thirds of whom live with moderate to
10 severe disabilities; and

11 WHEREAS, The United States spends an estimated \$56.8 billion

1 in direct and indirect costs on stroke each year; and

2 WHEREAS, Stroke symptoms include sudden trouble talking,
3 walking or seeing and sudden, severe headache with no known
4 cause; and

5 WHEREAS, Stroke is one of the most preventable of all life-
6 threatening health problems, yet many Americans cannot identify
7 a single symptom of stroke and many do not discuss stroke risks
8 with their primary health care providers; and

9 WHEREAS, Public awareness of stroke risks and warning signs
10 is essential to prevention and early treatment; and

11 WHEREAS, Prompt treatment of stroke can save lives and reduce
12 disability; and

13 WHEREAS, National Stroke Association observes "National
14 Stroke Awareness Month" in May and urges people to take charge
15 of their health by asking their doctors about stroke risks and
16 adopting healthy lifestyles; therefore be it

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
18 month of May 2006 as "Stroke Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania
19 and encourage all citizens to ask their doctors about stroke
20 prevention and warning signs.
