- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and
- immunities, further providing for criminal victim aid good
- 4 Samaritan civil immunity.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Section 8331.3 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania
- 8 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 9 § 8331.3. Criminal victim aid good Samaritan civil immunity.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- Any person who provides or obtains or
- 11 attempts to provide or obtain reasonable assistance for a victim
- 12 of a personal injury crime at the scene of the personal injury
- 13 crime or attempted personal injury crime shall not be liable for
- 14 any civil damages as a result of any acts or omissions in
- 15 providing or obtaining or attempting to provide or obtain
- 16 <u>reasonable</u> assistance, except any acts or omissions
- 17 intentionally designed to harm or any acts or omissions that
- 18 constitute gross negligence or willful, wanton or reckless
- 19 conduct.

- 1 (a.1) Duty to assist.—The following shall apply:
- 2 (1) A person at the scene of a personal injury crime or
- 3 attempted personal injury crime who knows that another person
- 4 <u>is exposed to or has suffered grave physical harm shall, to</u>
- 5 the extent that the person can do so without danger or peril
- 6 to self or others, give reasonable assistance to the victim.
- Reasonable assistance includes, but is not limited to,
- 8 <u>obtaining or attempting to obtain aid from law enforcement or</u>
- 9 <u>medical personnel.</u>
- 10 (2) A person who violates this subsection commits a
- 11 <u>summary offense.</u>
- 12 (b) Definitions.--The terms "personal injury crime" and
- 13 "victim" shall have the same meanings given to them in section
- 14 103 of the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as
- 15 the Crime Victims Act.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
