A RESOLUTION

- Honoring the life of Charles "Chuck" Philip Bednarik, Hall of Fame center and linebacker for the Philadelphia Eagles, and expressing condolences upon his passing.
- 4 WHEREAS, Charles "Chuck" Philip Bednarik was born on May 1,
- 5 1925, in Bethlehem; and
- 6 WHEREAS, After playing high school football, Mr. Bednarik
- 7 joined the United States Army Air Corps and flew 30 bombing
- 8 missions over Europe in World War II as a gunner on a B-24
- 9 Liberator; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik earned an Air Medal with four oak leaf
- 11 clusters and five battle stars for his courageous military
- 12 service; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik played college football at the
- 14 University of Pennsylvania, where he was a two-time All-American
- 15 and earned the Maxwell Award as the nation's most outstanding
- 16 player; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik was selected as the first pick by the
- 2 Philadelphia Eagles in the 1948 National Football League (NFL)
- 3 draft; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik was one of the last NFL players to
- 5 commonly play on both offense and defense; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Though he earned the nickname "Concrete Charlie" due
- 7 to his off-season career as a salesman for a concrete company,
- 8 the nickname also perfectly described his toughness on the
- 9 football field; and
- 10 WHEREAS, During his 14 seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles,
- 11 he won two championships, played in eight Pro Bowls and only
- 12 missed three games; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik was inducted to the Pro Football Hall
- 14 of Fame in 1967, his first year of eligibility, and to the
- 15 College Football Hall of Fame in 1969; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The college football defensive player of the year
- 17 award is named after Mr. Bednarik; and
- 18 WHEREAS, In 1987, the Philadelphia Eagles honored Mr.
- 19 Bednarik by retiring his jersey number; and
- 20 WHEREAS, After his football career, Mr. Bednarik served as
- 21 chairman of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Commission;
- 22 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik enjoyed golfing, polka music and
- 23 playing the harmonica and accordion; and
- 24 WHEREAS, He was a faithful member of St. Joseph Catholic
- 25 Church in Coopersburg; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik passed away on March 21, 2015, at 89
- 27 years of age in Richland; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Mr. Bednarik is survived by his wife of 67 years,
- 29 Emma; five daughters; 10 grandchildren; and one great-
- 30 grandchild; therefore be it
