A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of April 2016 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, Widespread public awareness is the first step in 3
- 4 addressing sexual assault and its prevention; and
- 5 WHEREAS, According to the National Sexual Violence Resource
- 6 Center, one in five women and one in 71 men will be sexually
- 7 assaulted at some point in their lives; and
- WHEREAS, Most victims of sexual assault are acquainted with 8
- their assailants; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Young people experience heightened rates of sexual
- 11 violence; and
- WHEREAS, One in four girls and one in six boys will be 12
- 13 sexually abused before reaching 18 years of age; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Being the victim of child sexual abuse doubles the
- 15 likelihood of adult sexual victimization; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Sexual assault is a significant problem on college
- 17 campuses; and
- 18 WHEREAS, One in five women and one in 16 men are sexually

- 1 assaulted during their college years; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Sixty-three percent of sexual assaults are never
- 3 reported to police; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Lack of reporting incidents of sexual assault allows
- 5 perpetrators to repeat the crime; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Sexual assault can have lasting, harmful effects on
- 7 survivors and their loved ones in our communities; and
- 8 WHEREAS, To preserve the safety and welfare of our fellow
- 9 citizens, we must confront harmful attitudes and actions; and
- 10 WHEREAS, To help the individual and social progress of our
- 11 fellow citizens, we must support survivors of sexual assault in
- 12 times of crisis and throughout their recovery; and
- 13 WHEREAS, To generate a comprehensive response to sexual
- 14 violence, we must highlight sexual assault prevention
- 15 initiatives, enhance opportunities to expose perpetrators,
- 16 bolster criminal justice programs and commit to breaking cycles
- 17 of violence and reducing crime rates in our communities; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The 2016 "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" campaign
- 19 is focusing on campus sexual violence prevention to create a
- 20 culture on college campuses of prevention and effective, trauma-
- 21 informed response; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 23 month of April 2016 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in
- 24 Pennsylvania.
