## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education
- 2 Program; and providing for powers and duties of the
- 3 Department of Health.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Reflex
- 8 Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 14 "RSDS." Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome.
- 15 Section 3. Findings.
- 16 Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome, also known as Complex

- 1 Regional Pain Syndrome, is a chronic neurological syndrome
- 2 characterized by severe burning pain, pathological changes in
- 3 bone and skin, tissue swelling and extreme sensitivity to touch.
- 4 Untreated, RSDS can result in permanent deformity and chronic
- 5 pain.
- 6 Section 4. Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education
- 7 Program.
- 8 (a) Establishment.--The department shall establish the
- 9 Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome Education Program to
- 10 promote public awareness of the causes of RSDS and the value of
- 11 early detection, diagnosis and treatment of this disease.
- 12 (b) Duties of department.--The department shall:
- 13 (1) Establish a public education and outreach campaign
- via written materials and brochures to promote awareness of
- 15 RSDS and enable individuals to make informed decisions about
- their health, including, but not limited to:
- 17 (i) Cause and nature of the disease.
- 18 (ii) Risk factors that contribute to the
- 19 manifestation of the disease.
- 20 (iii) All available treatment options, including
- 21 risks and benefits of said options.
- 22 (iv) Environmental safety and injury prevention.
- 23 (v) Rest and use of appropriate body mechanics.
- 24 (vi) Availability of RSDS diagnostic, treatment and
- outreach services in the community.
- 26 (vii) Any other factors or elements that might
- 27 mitigate the effects of this disease.
- 28 (2) Develop educational materials and brochures which
- shall be made available to consumers through State and local
- departments of health, hospitals, clinics and other health

- 1 care providers.
- 2 (3) Develop relationships with health care providers and
- 3 health-related community-based organizations to promote and
- 4 coordinate professional education programs on RSDS for,
- 5 including, but not limited to:
- 6 (i) Research findings.
- 7 (ii) Cause and nature of the disease.
- 8 (iii) Risk factors, including, but not limited to,
- 9 lifestyle, heredity and drug interactions.
- 10 (iv) Diagnostic procedures and appropriate
- indications for their use.
- 12 (v) All medical and surgical treatment options,
- including experimental and established drug therapies and
- 14 the benefits and risks of each option.
- 15 (vi) Environmental safety and injury prevention.
- 16 (vii) Availability of RSDS diagnosis, treatment and
- support services in the community.
- 18 Section 5. Grant acceptance.
- 19 The department may accept grants, services and property from
- 20 the Federal Government, foundations, organizations and other
- 21 entities as may be available to carry out the provisions of this
- 22 act.
- 23 Section 6. Effective date.
- 24 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
