- 1 § 2101. Scope of chapter.
- 2 This chapter relates to demographic impact statements.
- 3 § 2102. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 7 <u>"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing</u>
- 8 <u>established under 42 Pa.C.S. § 2151.2 (relating to commission).</u>
- 9 <u>§ 2103. Demographic impact statements.</u>
- 10 (a) Authorization. -- On request of a member of either chamber
- 11 of the General Assembly, the commission shall complete a
- 12 demographic impact statement for any bill or amendment to a bill
- 13 proposing a change to 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 97 (relating to sentencing)
- 14 or 18 Pa.C.S. (relating to crimes and offenses) to determine the
- 15 impact, if any, the proposed bill or amendment may have on the
- 16 demographic composition of the criminal offender population or
- 17 juvenile court system. The demographic impact statement shall be
- 18 impartial, simple and understandable.
- 19 (b) Bill.--Except as otherwise provided in subsection (e)
- 20 (1), a bill for which a demographic impact statement has been
- 21 requested under subsection (a) may not be given second
- 22 consideration by the chamber of the General Assembly whose
- 23 member made the request until such time as the commission has
- 24 attached the demographic impact statement.
- 25 <u>(c) Amendment.--Except as otherwise provided in subsection</u>
- 26 (e)(2), neither an amendment for which a demographic impact
- 27 statement has been requested under subsection (a) nor the bill
- 28 to which the amendment is offered shall be considered by the
- 29 <u>chamber of the General Assembly whose member made the request</u>
- 30 until such time as the commission has attached the demographic

- 1 <u>impact statement.</u>
- 2 (d) Contents. -- For groups for which data is available
- 3 regarding racial and ethnic composition, geographic and
- 4 <u>socioeconomic status, age, gender and religious and</u>
- 5 ethnoreligious affiliations, the demographic impact statement
- 6 <u>shall include the following:</u>
- 7 (1) An estimate of how the legislation would change the
- 8 <u>demographic composition of the criminal offender population</u>
- 9 <u>and juvenile court system.</u>
- 10 (2) A statement of the methodologies and assumptions
- 11 <u>used in preparing the estimate.</u>
- 12 (3) An estimate of the demographic composition of the
- crime victims who may be affected by the legislation.
- 14 (e) Failure to attach.--
- 15 (1) If the commission fails to attach a demographic
- impact statement to a bill within 10 days after a request for
- 17 a statement has been submitted to the commission, the bill
- 18 may be further considered in the same manner as if the
- 19 demographic impact statement is attached to the bill.
- 20 (2) If the commission fails to attach a demographic
- 21 impact statement to an amendment within 10 days after a
- request for a statement has been submitted to the commission,
- 23 the bill and the amendment may be considered in the same
- 24 manner as if the demographic impact statement is attached to
- 25 the amendment.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
