AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for special speed limitations.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section $3365(d)$ of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
§ 3365. Special speed limitations.

[(d) Penalty.--Any person violating any provision of this section is guilty of]
(d) Penalty.--
(1) Any person who violates subsection (a), (c) or (c.1)
commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 35$. Any person exceeding a maximum speed limit established under [this section] subsection (a), (c) or (c.1) by more than five miles per hour including a court not of record if it is exercising fine of $\$ 250$. Any person exceeding a maximum speed limit established under subsection (b) by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of $\$ 2$ per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour in excess of the maximum speed limit. In addition, the court,
jurisdiction pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § $1515(a)$, shall order the operating privilege of the person suspended for a period of three months. A copy of the order shall be transmitted to the department. Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
