## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, providing for GPS electronic monitoring devices.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 9778. GPS electronic monitoring devices.
9	(a) General rule The court may require a GPS electronic
10	monitoring device to be placed on an individual if the
11	individual is found:
12	(1) (i) to be in violation of the provisions of 61
13	Pa.C.S. § 6138 (relating to violation of terms of
14	<pre>parole); and</pre>
15	(ii) to present a substantial risk of committing a
16	crime punishable by imprisonment; or
17	(2) (i) to be in violation of the provisions of 23
18	Pa.C.S. § 6113 (relating to arrest for violation of

1	<u>order); and</u>
2	(ii) to present a substantial risk of inflicting
3	abuse as defined in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6102 (relating to
4	definitions) on the plaintiff or minor children, or both,
5	covered by the protection from abuse order.
6	(b) Time period The court shall order that:
7	(1) An individual subject to subsection (a)(1) wear the
8	GPS electronic monitoring device for a reasonable period of
9	time as determined by the court.
LO	(2) An individual subject to subsection (a)(2) wear the
L1	GPS electronic monitoring device for a period not to exceed
L2	the term of the protection from abuse order or renewal
13	thereof.
L 4	(c) Hearing
L5	(1) In the event a court orders the individual to wear a
L 6	GPS monitoring device for a time period less than the
L7	remainder of the term of the protection from abuse order, the
18	court shall notify the plaintiff and minor children protected
L 9	by the protection from abuse order of the impending removal
20	of the device at least 30 days prior to its removal.
21	(2) The plaintiff and minor children covered by the
22	protection from abuse order shall have the right to request a
23	hearing with the court, and request, subject to subsection
24	(b)(2), an extension of the order for wearing the GPS
25	monitoring device by the defendant.
26	(3) If the plaintiff or minor children covered by the
27	protection from abuse order request a hearing, the GPS
28	electronic monitoring device may not be removed until the
29	hearing has taken place.
30	(4) The court may extend the order mandating the

- 1 plaintiff wear a GPS electronic monitoring device until the
- 2 <u>expiration of the protection from abuse order.</u>
- 3 (d) Removal of GPS electronic monitoring device. -- A GPS
- 4 <u>electronic monitoring device may not be removed from the</u>
- 5 individual ordered to wear it until 30 days after the time
- 6 period established under subsection (b) or (c) expires.
- 7 (e) Costs.--The individual ordered to wear the GPS
- 8 <u>electronic monitoring device shall be responsible for the costs</u>
- 9 <u>associated with the GPS electronic monitoring device.</u>
- 10 (f) Definitions. -- The following words and phrases, as used
- 11 <u>in this section, shall have the meanings given to them in this</u>
- 12 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 13 "GPS." A global positioning system operated by the United
- 14 States Department of Defense that provides specially coded
- 15 satellite signals that may be processed by a receiver to compute
- 16 location.
- 17 "GPS electronic monitoring device." A device that enables
- 18 the location of an individual wearing the device to be recorded
- 19 through use of GPS and related technology and is designed so
- 20 that the device:
- 21 (1) Passively monitors, identifies and records location
- 22 data.
- 23 (2) Permits the Pennsylvania State Police and any local
- 24 police department to download location data, record it
- 25 <u>securely and confidentially retain it indefinitely.</u>
- 26 (3) May be worn around an individual's wrist or ankle.
- 27 (4) Once fitted around an individual's wrist or ankle,
- 28 may not be removed without employing specialized equipment
- 29 specifically designed for that purpose.
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
