## AN ACT

9	Section 1. 65th U.S. Infantry Regiment, Borinqueneers

1	(a) FindingsThe General Assembly finds as follows:
.2	(1) "The Borinqueneers" were the only all-Hispanic unit
_3	in the history of the United States Army.
4	(2) "The Borinqueneers" is a nickname for the 65th
.5	Infantry Regiment of the 3rd Division in the United States
6	Army, an all-volunteer Puerto Rican unit. The name was
_7	derived from the name boringuen meaning "land of the brave

- 2 (3) The unit was founded in 1899 and remained a vital
- 3 part of the United States Armed Forces until 1956.
- 4 (4) "The Borinqueneers" displayed valiant and
- 5 meritorious service in World War I, World War II and the
- 6 Korean War.
- 7 (5) More than 62,000 Puerto Ricans joined the military
- 8 during World War II and more than 43,000 Puerto Ricans served
- 9 in the Korean War.
- 10 (6) While in Korea, "the Borinqueneers" served in nine
- 11 separate military campaigns, where hundreds of men gave their
- 12 lives in service to their country.
- 13 (7) In 1959, the regiment was allotted to the Puerto
- 14 Rico Army National Guard, where the 1st Battalion, 65th
- 15 Infantry still serves.
- 16 (8) Since inception of the unit, more than 20,000 Puerto
- 17 Ricans have served as "Boringueneers," but their
- 18 contributions and sacrifices have gone largely unnoticed by
- 19 the country at large.
- 20 (9) While defending the United States, these brave
- 21 soldiers have earned 628 Bronze Stars, 258 Silver Stars, 10
- Distinguished Service Crosses and more than 2,700 Purple
- Hearts.
- 24 (b) Designation.--The bridge carrying <del>U.S. Route 222</del>
- 25 Business STATE ROUTE 2005 (BUSINESS ROUTE 222) over the
- 26 Schuylkill River, Riverfront Drive and Norfolk Southern Railroad

- 27 in the City of Reading, Berks County, commonly referred to as
- 28 the Bingaman Street Bridge, is hereby designated the 65th U.S.
- 29 Infantry Regiment, Borinqueneers Memorial Bridge.
- 30 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and

- 1 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
- 2 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
