## AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 1 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 2 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating 3 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 5 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," in 16 distilleries, wineries, bonded warehouses, bailees for hire 17 and transporters for hire, further providing for 18 distilleries. 19 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 21 hereby enacts as follows: 22 Section 1. Section 505.4(b) of the act of April 12, 1951 23 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended 24 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) is amended by adding clauses to 25 read:
- 26 Section 505.4. Distilleries.--\* \* \*

- 1 (b) \* \* :
- 2 (8) At the discretion of the board, obtain a special permit
- 3 to participate in distilled liquor, alcoholic cider, wine and
- 4 <u>food expositions off the licensed premises. A special permit</u>
- 5 shall be issued upon proper application and payment of a fee of
- 6 thirty dollars (\$30) per day for each day of permitted use, not
- 7 to exceed thirty (30) consecutive days. The total number of days
- 8 for all the special permits may not exceed one hundred (100)
- 9 days in any calendar year. A special permit shall entitle the
- 10 holder to engage in the sale by the glass, by the bottle or in
- 11 <u>case lots of distilled liquor produced by the permittee under</u>
- 12 the authority of a limited distillery license. Holders of
- 13 <u>special permits may provide tasting samples of distilled liquors</u>
- 14 <u>in individual portions not to exceed one fluid ounce. Samples at</u>
- 15 distilled liquor, alcoholic cider, wine and food expositions may
- 16 be sold or offered free of charge. Except as provided herein,
- 17 limited distilleries utilizing special permits shall be governed
- 18 by all applicable provisions of this act as well as by all
- 19 applicable regulations or conditions adopted by the board.
- 20 For the purposes of this clause, "distilled liquor, alcoholic
- 21 cider, wine and food expositions" are defined as affairs held
- 22 indoors or outdoors with the intent of promoting Pennsylvania
- 23 products by educating those in attendance of the availability,
- 24 nature and quality of Pennsylvania-produced distilled liquors,
- 25 alcoholic ciders and wines in conjunction with suitable food
- 26 displays, demonstrations and sales. The term may also include
- 27 <u>activities other than distilled liquor, alcoholic cider, wine</u>
- 28 and food displays, including arts and crafts, musical
- 29 activities, cultural exhibits, agricultural exhibits and farmers
- 30 markets.

- 1 (9) At the discretion of the board, obtain a farmers market
- 2 permit. The permit shall entitle the holder to participate in
- 3 more than one farmers market at any given time and an unlimited
- 4 <u>number throughout the year and sell distilled liquors produced</u>
- 5 <u>under the authority of the underlying limited distillery license</u>
- 6 by the bottle or in case lots. Samples not to exceed one fluid
- 7 once per brand of distilled liquor may be offered free of
- 8 <u>charge. A farmers market permit shall be issued upon proper</u>
- 9 application and payment of an annual fee of two hundred fifty
- 10 dollars (\$250). A permit holder may participate in more than one
- 11 farmers market at any given time. Sales by permit holders shall
- 12 take place during the standard hours of operation of the farmers
- 13 market. Written notice of the date, times and location the
- 14 permit is to be used shall be provided by the permit holder to
- 15 the enforcement bureau at least two (2) weeks prior to the
- 16 <u>event. Except as provided in this subsection, limited</u>
- 17 distilleries utilizing farmers market permits shall be governed
- 18 by all applicable provisions of this act as well as by all
- 19 applicable regulations adopted by the board.
- For the purposes of this clause, "farmers market" shall
- 21 include any building, structure or other place:
- 22 (i) owned, leased or otherwise in the possession of a
- 23 person, municipal corporation or public or private organization;
- 24 (ii) used or intended to be used by two or more farmers or
- 25 an association of farmers, who are certified by the Department
- 26 of Agriculture of the Commonwealth to participate in the
- 27 Farmers' Market Nutrition Program subject to 7 CFR Pt. 249
- 28 (relating to Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)),
- 29 for the purpose of selling agricultural commodities produced in
- 30 this Commonwealth directly to consumers;

- 1 (iii) which is physically located within this Commonwealth;
- 2 <u>and</u>
- 3 (iv) which is not open for business more than twelve hours
- 4 <u>each day.</u>

- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
