## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in pupils and attendance, providing for exception from compulsory education for certain children 5 6 with disabilities. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 11 12 section to read: 13 Section 1330.1. Exception from Compulsory Education for 14 Certain Children with Disabilities .-- (a) Beginning with the 15 2024-2025 school year, a parent or quardian of a child six (6) 16 years of age who is required to attend school in this 17 Commonwealth for the first time may submit to the department a
- 19 attendance under this act for the child if the following apply:

request for a waiver from the requirements of compulsory

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- 1 (1) The child has been clinically diagnosed by a qualified
- 2 <u>health professional with autism spectrum disorder or has been</u>
- 3 identified by the State as having developmental delays or
- 4 intellectual disabilities.
- 5 (2) The child has been assessed in the last six (6) months
- 6 by a qualified health professional approved by the State and has
- 7 been clinically or medically recommended for continued intensive
- 8 <u>and high-structured early-intervention services based on the</u>
- 9 <u>child's development and functional skill set.</u>
- 10 (3) The parent or quardian provides proof that alternative
- 11 services are being provided to the child or documentation of
- 12 <u>effort to obtain services for the child.</u>
- (b) Upon receipt of a waiver request under subsection (a),
- 14 the department shall notify the school district of residence.
- 15 <u>(c) If the requirements of subsection (a) are met, the</u>
- 16 <u>department shall approve the waiver for a period not to exceed</u>
- 17 one (1) year and send an approval letter to the parent or
- 18 guardian and school district of residence.
- 19 (d) The parent or quardian of a child whose request for a
- 20 waiver has been approved by the department under subsection (c)
- 21 shall retain the right to enroll the child in the school
- 22 district of residence at any time during the school year.
- 23 (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
- 24 following shall apply:
- 25 (1) During the waiver period, the child shall be considered
- 26 an "eligible young child" under the act of December 19, 1990
- 27 (P.L.1372, No.212), known as the Early Intervention Services
- 28 System Act, for the purposes of receiving early intervention
- 29 services.
- 30 (2) At the end of the waiver period, a parent or quardian

- 1 may enroll the child in kindergarten or first grade for the next
- 2 <u>school year.</u>
- 3 (f) The department shall issue guidelines to implement this
- 4 <u>section within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this</u>
- 5 subsection.
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
