## AN ACT

- Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for limitations on the use of plastic checkout bags by certain stores; and imposing a penalty.

- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 1 § 6401. Legislative findings and purpose of chapter.
- 2 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds as follows:
- 3 (1) On a global level, the production of plastic bags
- 4 <u>has a significant environmental impact each year, including</u>
- 5 <u>the use of more than 12,000,000 barrels of oil and the deaths</u>
- 6 of thousands of marine animals through ingestion and
- 7 <u>entanglement</u>.
- 8 (2) Each year an estimated 500,000,000,000 to
- 9 <u>1,000,000,000,000 plastic bags are used worldwide, which is</u>
- more than 1,000,000 bags per minute, of which billions of
- 11 <u>bags end up as litter each year.</u>
- 12 (3) Most plastic checkout bags are not biodegradable,
- which means that the bags break down into smaller and smaller
- toxic bits that contaminate soil and waterways and enter into
- the food web when animals accidentally ingest those
- 16 materials.
- 17 (b) Purpose of chapter.--It is the purpose of this chapter
- 18 to reduce the adverse environmental impact of plastic checkout
- 19 bags by limiting the availability of single-use plastic checkout
- 20 bags and encouraging the use of reusable bags.
- 21 § 6402. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 23 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 24 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 25 <u>"ASTM standard." The American Society for Testing Materials</u>
- 26 <u>International Standard D6400 for compostable plastics.</u>
- 27 <u>"Checkout bag." A carryout bag provided by a store to a</u>
- 28 <u>customer at the point of sale.</u>
- 29 <u>"Compostable plastic checkout bag." A plastic checkout bag</u>
- 30 that conforms to the ASTM standard for compostable plastics as

- 1 confirmed by the Department of Environmental Protection.
- 2 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
- 3 the Commonwealth.
- 4 <u>"Reusable fabric checkout bag." A checkout bag made of cloth</u>
- 5 or other machine washable fabric that has handles.
- 6 <u>"Reusable plastic checkout bag." A durable plastic checkout</u>
- 7 bag with handles, that is at least 2.25 mils thick and is
- 8 specifically designed and manufactured for repeated uses.
- 9 <u>"Single-use plastic checkout bag." A plastic checkout bag</u>
- 10 that does not meet the definition of a compostable plastic
- 11 <u>checkout bag or a reusable plastic checkout bag.</u>
- 12 "Store." A retail establishment that meets all of the
- 13 <u>following:</u>
- 14 (1) Is a full-line, self-service retail supermarket with
- annual gross sales of \$1,000,000 or more and which sells a
- line of dry groceries, canned goods or nonfood items and some
- 17 perishable items.
- 18 (2) Has more than 10,000 square feet of retail space.
- 19 § 6403. Limitations on use of checkout bags.
- 20 <u>(a) Limitations.--</u>
- 21 (1) Beginning January 1, 2011, no more than two-thirds
- 22 of checkout bags provided by a store for customer use may be
- 23 single-use plastic checkout bags.
- 24 (2) Beginning January 1, 2013, no more than one-third of
- 25 checkout bags provided by a store for customer use may be
- 26 single-use plastic checkout bags.
- 27 (3) Beginning January 1, 2015, a store shall not provide
- 28 <u>single-use plastic checkout bags to customers.</u>
- 29 (b) Other bags.--Nothing in this section shall preclude
- 30 stores from making compostable plastic checkout bags, reusable

- 1 plastic checkout bags, reusable fabric checkout bags or paper
- 2 checkout bags available to customers.
- 3 § 6404. At-store recycling program.
- 4 A store shall establish an at-store recycling program to
- 5 provide an opportunity for a customer of the store to return to
- 6 the store clean, single-use plastic checkout bags. An at-store
- 7 recycling program shall including all of the following:
- 8 (1) A checkout bag collection bin shall be placed at
- 9 <u>each store and shall be visible, easily accessible to</u>
- 10 customers and clearly marked that the collection bin is
- 11 <u>available for the purpose of collecting and recycling single-</u>
- 12 <u>use plastic checkout bags.</u>
- 13 (2) The maintenance of records describing the
- 14 collection, transport and recycling of single-use plastic
- 15 <u>checkout bags collected. The store shall maintain the records</u>
- 16 <u>for a minimum of six years and shall make the records</u>
- 17 available to the department, upon request, to demonstrate
- 18 compliance with this chapter.
- 19 (b) Expiration.--This section shall expire December 31,
- 20 2014.
- 21 § 6405. Regulations.
- 22 The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary
- 23 to implement the provisions of this chapter.
- 24 § 6406. Penalties.
- 25 (a) Imposition. -- The department may impose a civil penalty
- 26 in the amount of \$500 for a first violation of this chapter,
- 27 \$1,000 for a second violation and \$2,000 for a third or
- 28 <u>subsequent violation</u>.
- 29 (b) Payments. -- Any civil penalty collected pursuant to
- 30 subsection (a) shall be paid into the Recycling Fund.

- 1 Section 2. This act shall take effect as follows:
- (1) The addition of 27 Pa.C.S. § 6404 shall take effect 2
- in 180 days. 3
- (2) The remainder of this act shall take effect 4
- immediately. 5
