## AN ACT

6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Section 8(b)(1) of the act of December 19, 1984
8	(P.L.1093, No.219), known as the Noncoal Surface Mining
9	Conservation and Reclamation Act, is amended by to read:
10	Section 8. Permit approval or denial.

12	(b) Other grounds for refusal to issue, renew or amend
13	permit
14	(1) The department shall not issue any surface mining
15	permit or renew or amend any permit if it finds, after
16	investigation and an opportunity for an informal hearing,
17	that:
18	(i) the applicant has failed and continues to fail

to comply with any of the provisions of this act or the
 act of May 31, 1945 (P.L.1198, No.418), known as the
 Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act; or

4 (ii) the applicant has shown a lack of ability or
5 intention to comply with any provision of this act or the
6 Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, as
7 indicated by past or continuing violations[.]; or

8 (iii) there is significant evidence and concern that surface or groundwater contamination could result from 9 the disturbance of ground contaminated with hazardous 10 substances from previous activities at the site. 11 12 Any person, partnership, association or corporation that has 13 engaged in unlawful conduct, as defined in section 23, or that has a partner, associate, officer, parent corporation, 14 15 subsidiary corporation, contractor or subcontractor that has 16 engaged in such unlawful conduct shall be denied any permit 17 required by this act unless the permit application 18 demonstrates that the unlawful conduct is being corrected to the satisfaction of the department. 19 \* \* \* 20

21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
