AN ACT

- 1 Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and
 - Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 3 Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of
- ethnic intimidation; and, in particular rights and
- 5 immunities, further prohibiting civil rights violations.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:

- 8 Section 1. Section 2710 heading, (a) and (c) of Title 18 of
- 9 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended by the act of
- 10 December 3, 2002 (P.L.1176, No.143), declared unconstitutional,
- 11 936 A.2d 188 (Pa. Commonwealth 2007), affirmed, 597 Pa. 371
- 12 (2008), are amended and the section is amended by adding a
- 13 subsection to read:
- 14 § 2710. [Ethnic] Hate-based intimidation.
- 15 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits [the offense of
- 16 ethnic intimidation if, with malicious intention toward the

- 1 race, color, religion or national origin of another individual
- 2 or group of individuals, he commits an offense under any other
- 3 provision of this article or under Chapter 33 (relating to
- 4 arson, criminal mischief and other property destruction)
- 5 exclusive of section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism)
- 6 or under section 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) with
- 7 respect to such individual or his or her property or with
- 8 respect to one or more members of such group or to their
- 9 property.] a hate crime if that person intentionally selects the
- 10 person against whom the crime is committed or the property
- 11 damaged or otherwise affected by the crime, in whole or in part,
- 12 because of the actual or perceived race, color, religion,
- 13 <u>national origin, ancestry, sex, gender, gender identity, gender</u>
- 14 expression, sexual orientation or disability of an individual or
- 15 group of individuals and commits:
- 16 (1) A personal injury crime as defined in section 103 of
- the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the
- 18 Crime Victims Act.
- 19 (2) An offense under Chapter 33 (relating to arson,
- criminal mischief and other property destruction), exclusive
- of section 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism).
- 22 (3) An offense under section 3503 (relating to criminal
- trespass).
- 24 * * *
- 25 (b.1) Construction. -- Nothing in this section may be
- 26 construed to prohibit, limit or punish religiously motivated
- 27 <u>speech or conduct that is otherwise protected by the</u>
- 28 Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of
- 29 Pennsylvania or the act of December 9, 2002 (P.L.1701, No.214),
- 30 known as the Religious Freedom Protection Act.

- 1 [(c) Definition.--As used in this section "malicious
- 2 intention" means the intention to commit any act, the commission
- 3 of which is a necessary element of any offense referred to in
- 4 subsection (a) motivated by hatred toward the race, color,
- 5 religion or national origin of another individual or group of
- 6 individuals.]
- 7 Section 2. Section 8309(a) of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 8 § 8309. Civil rights violations.
- 9 (a) Redress for personal injury.--
- 10 <u>(1)</u> A person who incurs injury to his <u>or her</u> person
- [or], damage or loss to his or her property, has been placed
- in reasonable fear of bodily injury or suffered substantial
- 13 emotional distress as a result of conduct described in 18
- Pa.C.S. § 2710 (relating to [ethnic] <u>hate-based</u> intimidation)
- or 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism) shall have a
- right of action [against the actor] in the court of common
- 17 pleas for preliminary or permanent injunction, damages or
- other appropriate civil or equitable relief[.] against all of_
- 19 the following:
- 20 <u>(i) The actor.</u>
- 21 (ii) A person who has solicited the actor to engage
- in the conduct.
- (iii) A person who has attempted to provide or
- 24 provided aid to the actor with the intent that the actor
- engaged in the conduct.
- 26 (2) In the action, the issue of whether the defendant
- 27 engaged in the conduct alleged shall be determined according
- to the burden of proof used in other civil actions for
- 29 similar relief.
- 30 (3) The plaintiff may seek recovery for any of the

- [(1)] (i) General and special damages, including
 damages for emotional distress. Damages under this
 paragraph shall be actual damages or \$500, whichever is
 greater.
 - [(2)] <u>(ii)</u> Punitive damages.
- 7 [(3)] <u>(iii)</u> Reasonable attorney fees and costs.
- 8 [(4)] <u>(iv)</u> Injunctive and other equitable relief.

12 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
