AN ACT

- Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in particular rights and immunities, providing for certain immunity for hospitals that
- donate medicine, medical supplies and equipment in good faith
- for humanitarian assistance.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 9 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 § 8338.2. Liability for damages from donated medicine, medical
- 11 <u>supplies and equipment for humanitarian assistance.</u>
- 12 (a) General rule. -- A hospital is not subject to civil
- 13 <u>liability arising from the nature or condition of medicine</u>,
- 14 medical supplies and equipment which were reasonably believed to
- 15 be in good condition and donated by the hospital in good faith
- 16 for humanitarian assistance.
- 17 <u>(b) Nonapplicability.--This section does not apply to an</u>
- 18 <u>injury or death to a person that results from an act or omission</u>
- 19 of a hospital constituting gross negligence, recklessness or

- 1 <u>intentional misconduct.</u>
- 2 (c) Construction. -- This section shall not be construed as
- 3 <u>establishing any liability.</u>
- 4 (d) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 5 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 6 <u>subsection:</u>
- 7 "Donate." To give or distribute without requiring anything
- 8 of monetary value from the ultimate recipient.
- 9 "Hospital." An entity licensed as a hospital under the act
- 10 of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare
- 11 Code, or the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the
- 12 Health Care Facilities Act.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
