## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2015 as "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Ovarian cancer is the ninth most common cancer among
- 4 women and the fifth leading cause of cancer death among women;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Approximately 21,980 women are diagnosed with
- 7 ovarian cancer each year and more than 14,000 women in the
- 8 United States die from ovarian cancer each year; and
- 9 WHEREAS, No adequate screening test exists for ovarian
- 10 cancer; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Most cases of ovarian cancer are diagnosed at Stage
- 12 III or later when the cancer already has begun to spread to
- 13 lymph nodes and outside of the pelvis; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Early detection improves the chances of survival,
- 15 with a 93% five-year survival rate if detected at the earliest
- 16 stages; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Every woman is at risk for ovarian cancer regardless
- 2 of age, heritage or medical history; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Many women who are diagnosed with ovarian cancer
- 4 have a genetic history that may include carrying the BRCA
- 5 mutation gene and a family history of ovarian cancer; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Ovarian cancer typically occurs in women in their
- 7 fifties and sixties, with a median age of 63; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Symptoms are often subtle and easily confused with
- 9 other ailments, including bloating, pelvic or abdominal pain,
- 10 difficulty eating or feeling full quickly, urinary urgency or
- 11 frequency, weight gain, backaches, shortness of breath, extreme
- 12 fatigue and nausea; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Ovarian cancer awareness and education are important
- 14 factors in diagnosis and treatment; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 16 2015 as "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
