A RESOLUTION

- 1 Observing the month of November 2005 as "Lung Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Lung cancer is the leading cause of deaths from
- 4 cancer in the United States among both men and women; and
- 5 WHEREAS, More than 160,000 deaths from lung cancer occurred
- 6 in 2004; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Lung cancer incidence rates and death rates among
- 8 white men and African-American men are decreasing, but rates
- 9 among women are sharply increasing; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The leading causes of lung cancer, in order, are
- 11 smoking cigarettes, cigars and pipes; secondhand smoke; radon;
- 12 and on-the-job exposure to carcinogens such as asbestos,
- 13 uranium, arsenic and certain petroleum products; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The two major types of lung cancer are nonsmall cell
- 15 lung cancer, which is the more common type, and small cell, or
- 16 oat cell, lung cancer; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Small cell lung cancer is the more aggressive, fast-
- 2 spreading type of lung cancer and accounts for about 20% of all
- 3 lung cancers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Symptoms of lung cancer are chronic cough,
- 5 hoarseness, coughing up blood, weight loss and loss of appetite,
- 6 shortness of breath, fever without a known reason, wheezing,
- 7 repeated bouts of bronchitis or pneumonia and chest pain; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Lung cancer can be prevented by stopping smoking,
- 9 living and working in a smoke-free environment, testing home
- 10 radon levels and installing treatment as necessary to reduce
- 11 radon to the level of four picocuries per liter of air; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Ongoing education about lung cancer causes and
- 13 prevention is necessary to reduce the incidence of this
- 14 devastating disease; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Senate observe the month of November 2005
- 16 as "Lung Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
