AN ACT

- Amending the act of November 22, 1978 (P.L.1166, No.274), entitled "An act establishing the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, providing for its powers and duties establishing several advisory committees within the commission and providing for their powers and duties," providing for County Adult Probation and Parole Advisory 7 Committee, FOR COUNTY PROBATION OFFICERS' FIREARM EDUCATION AND TRAINING, for justice reinvestment grants, phase 2, for 8 continuing county probation and parole grants and for county 9 intermediate punishment funding; making an appropriation; and <--10 making a related repeal. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The act of November 22, 1978 (P.L.1166, No.274), 15 referred to as the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and 16 Delinquency Law, is amended by adding sections to read: 17 Section 6.1. County Adult Probation and Parole Advisory 18 Committee. 19 (a) Establishment. -- The County Adult Probation and Parole
- 20 Advisory Committee is established within the commission.

1	(b) Composition The committee shall consist of the
2	<pre>following members:</pre>
3	(1) The chairman of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation
4	and Parole or a designee, who shall serve as an ex officio
5	and nonvoting member.
6	(2) The Chair of the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission
7	or a designee, who shall serve as an ex officio and nonvoting
8	member.
9	(3) The Executive Director of the Pennsylvania
10	Commission on Sentencing, or a designee, who shall serve as
11	an ex officio and nonvoting member.
12	(4) The President of the County Commissioners
13	Association of Pennsylvania or a designee.
14	(5) The Executive Director of the County Chief Adult
15	Probation and Parole Officers Association of Pennsylvania or
16	a designee.
17	(6) The Victim Advocate.
18	(7) The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania or a
19	designee.
20	(8) The President of the Pennsylvania District
21	Attorneys' Association or a designee.
22	(8.1) The President of the Pennsylvania Association of
23	Criminal Defense Lawyers or a designee.
24	(9) A county chief probation and parole officer
25	appointed by the Chief Justice of Pennsylvania.
26	(10) A county commissioner or a home rule equivalent
27	appointed by the Governor.
28	(11) Seven judges of the courts of common pleas who
29	serve in the criminal court area and are representative of

- 2 (c) Initial appointments to committee. --
- 3 (1) As designated by the Chief Justice of Pennsylvania
- 4 <u>at the time of appointment and until successors are</u>
- 5 appointed, the following shall apply to appointees initially
- appointed under subsection (b) (9) and (11):
- 7 <u>(i) Three appointees shall serve an initial term of</u>
- 8 two years.
- 9 <u>(ii) Three appointees shall serve an initial term of</u>
- three years.
- 11 (iii) Two appointees shall serve an initial term of
- 12 <u>four years.</u>
- 13 (2) An appointment to fill a vacancy created by a member
- 14 <u>appointed in accordance with paragraph (1) shall be for the</u>
- 15 remainder of the unexpired term.
- 16 (3) Members appointed under subsection (b) (1), (2), (3),
- 17 (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), (8.1) and (10) shall serve by virtue
- of the member's office, and the member's term shall be
- 19 concurrent with the member's service in the office.
- 20 <u>(d) Terms of office.--Except as provided in subsection (c)</u>
- 21 (1), the term of office of a member appointed under subsection
- 22 (b) (9) or (11) shall be four years. No member shall be appointed
- 23 for more than two consecutive terms.
- (e) Conditions of appointment. -- The committee and the
- 25 committee's members are subject to the same limitations and
- 26 conditions imposed upon the commission under section 2(e), (h),
- (i), (m) and (n).
- 28 (f) Quorum. -- A majority of the voting members shall
- 29 constitute a quorum and a vote of the majority of the voting
- 30 members present shall be sufficient for all actions.

1	(g) Committee chair The chairperson of the commission
2	shall appoint a committee chair from among the judges on the
3	committee, who shall serve at the pleasure of the chairperson. A
4	vice committee chair shall be designated by the committee chair
5	and shall preside at meetings in the chair's absence. The
6	committee shall meet at the call of the committee chair, but not
7	less than four times per year.
8	(h) Powers and duties The County Adult Probation and
9	Parole Advisory Committee, with the review and approval of the
10	<pre>commission, shall:</pre>
11	(1) Review and comment on grant applications for county
12	intermediate punishment programs or discretionary grants.
13	(2) Develop a funding plan for county adult probation
14	and parole departments that includes county intermediate
15	punishment programs, discretionary grants and a funding
16	formula. Counties supervising larger numbers of individuals
17	with significant risk and need scores shall receive greater
18	consideration in grant awards. The committee shall consider
19	the following in developing the funding formula:
20	(i) The number of people in the county that were
21	sentenced to probation supervision in the prior year.
22	(ii) The number of people in the county that were
23	under judicial supervision in pretrial status in the
24	community in the prior year.
25	(iii) The number of people in the county that were
26	<pre>placed under county probation supervision following STATE_<-</pre>
27	OR county incarceration in the prior year.
28	(IV) THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN THE COUNTY THAT WERE <-
29	DISCHARGED FROM PROBATION SUPERVISION IN THE PRIOR YEAR.
30	(iv) (V) The offense gravity score and prior record <-

1	score of persons in the county under the supervision of
2	county probation in the prior year.
3	(V) (VI) The risk and need score of persons in the
4	county under the supervision of county probation, as
5	determined through the use of a validated and commission-
6	approved instrument.
7	(vi)(VII) The county's FULL submission of data to <
8	the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing, and the
9	commission's certification of the county's compliance
10	with guidelines and the county's current intermediate
11	<pre>punishment plan for imposing restrictive conditions</pre>
12	(VIII) CERTIFICATION BY THE PENNSYLVANIA COMMISSION
13	ON SENTENCING OF THE COUNTY'S COMPLIANCE WITH GUIDELINES
14	AND THE COUNTY'S CURRENT INTERMEDIATE PUNISHMENT PLAN FOR
15	IMPOSING RESTRICTIVE CONDITIONS.
16	(3) Advise on all matters pertaining to the
17	administration of the county adult probation and parole
18	system.
19	(4) Analyze data to identify trends and to determine the
20	effectiveness of programs and practices to ensure the
21	reasonable and efficient administration of the county adult
22	probation and parole system.
23	(5) Make recommendations and adopt standards for
24	probation and parole personnel, including standards for
25	services, caseload standards, risk assessment, responses to
26	violations, COLLECTION OF RESTITUTION and other evidence-
27	based programs and practices.
28	(6) Assist the commission in the implementation of 42
29	Pa.C.S. Ch. 98 (relating to county intermediate punishment).
30	(7) Within one year of the effective date of this

- 2 Probation Officers' Firearm Education and Training Commission
- 3 established under 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 (relating to county-
- 4 <u>probation officers' firearm education and training), appoint</u>
- 5 <u>a subcommittee with expertise comparable to that of the</u>
- 6 current membership of the County Probation Officers' Firearm
- 7 Education and Training Commission and assume responsibility
- 8 <u>and oversight for the firearm education and training of</u>
- 9 county adult and juvenile probation and parole officers.
- 10 (7) Report annually to the Governor and General <--
- 11 Assembly on the distribution and use of funding under
- paragraphs (1) and (2).
- 13 (i) Staff.--Staff support shall be made available to the
- 14 committee by the executive director of the commission in order
- 15 to adequately perform the duties provided for under this
- 16 section.
- 17 (j) Authority not diminished. -- This section may not be
- 18 interpreted to diminish the authority of a president judge in a
- 19 <u>supervising county's probation and parole department.</u>
- 20 <u>SECTION 6.2. COUNTY PROBATION OFFICERS' FIREARM EDUCATION AND</u> <--
- TRAINING.
- 22 (A) COMMISSION COMPOSITION. -- THE COMMITTEE SHALL SERVE AS
- 23 THE COUNTY PROBATION OFFICERS' FIREARM EDUCATION AND TRAINING
- 24 COMMISSION UNDER 61 PA.C.S. CH. 63 (RELATING TO COUNTY PROBATION
- 25 OFFICERS' FIREARM EDUCATION AND TRAINING), INCLUDING ASSUMING
- 26 ALL OF ITS FUNDING, POWERS, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.
- 27 (B) ADVISORY SUBCOMMITTEE. -- THE COMMITTEE SHALL APPOINT A
- 28 SUBCOMMITTEE WITH EXPERTISE COMPARABLE TO THAT OF THE FORMER
- 29 MEMBERSHIP OF THE COUNTY PROBATION OFFICERS' FIREARM EDUCATION
- 30 AND TRAINING COMMISSION.

- 1 <u>Section 9.1. Justice reinvestment grants, phase 2.</u>
- 2 (a) Justice Reinvestment Fund. -- The Justice Reinvestment
- 3 Fund will be utilized to support programs and activities to
- 4 <u>improve the delivery of criminal justice services within this</u>
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 (b) Savings assessment.--For fiscal years 2020-2021, 2021- <--
- 7 2022, 2022-2023 and, 2023-2024 AND 2024-2025, the Office of the <--
- 8 Budget shall develop a formula to calculate the amount of <--
- 9 savings to the Department of Corrections in the prior fiscal
- 10 year. The calculation shall include all of CONSIST OF SAVINGS <--
- 11 FROM the following:
- 12 (1) implementation of short sentence parole under 61
- Pa.C.S. § 6137.5 (relating to short sentence parole);
- 14 (2) increased use of the State drug treatment program
- under 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 41 (relating to State intermediate
- 16 punishment); or
- 17 (3) use of sanctions for technical parole violations
- 18 under 61 Pa.C.S. § 6138(c)(8) (relating to violation of terms
- of parole).
- 20 (c) Deposit. -- The following amounts shall be deposited into
- 21 the Justice Reinvestment Fund:
- 22 (1) In fiscal year 2020 2021 2021-2022, an amount not to <--
- exceed 100% of the amount determined CALCULATED to be savings <--
- in the prior fiscal year.
- 25 (2) In fiscal vear 2021-2022, YEARS 2022-2023, 2023-2024 <--
- 26 AND 2024-2025, an amount IN EACH YEAR not to exceed 50% of
- 27 <u>the amount determined CALCULATED to be savings in the prior</u> <-
- 28 fiscal year.
- 29 (3) In fiscal years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 YEAR 2025-
- 30 2026, an amount $\frac{1}{2}$ each year not to exceed $\frac{50}{8}$ 90% of the <--

- 2 <u>fiscal year.</u>
- 3 (d) Distributions.--For fiscal years 2020-2021, 2021-2022, <--
- 4 <u>2022-2023 and</u>, <u>2023-2024 AND 2024-2025</u>, the sum of \$250,000 <-
- 5 shall be distributed to the commission for the purpose of crime
- 6 victim compensation and the sum of \$400,000 shall be distributed
- 7 to the Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing to implement risk
- 8 <u>assessment and justice reinvestment sentencing features. The</u>
- 9 remaining deposits in subsection (c) shall be distributed to the <--

- 10 commission for formula funding to county probation and parole
- 11 departments, as advised by the County Adult Probation and Parole
- 12 Advisory Committee under section 6.1. UNDER SECTION 10.1.
- 13 (e) Restriction. -- Grants awarded under this section shall be
- 14 <u>annual grants and shall be used to supplement and not supplant</u>
- 15 existing funding, including funding provided by county
- 16 governments.
- 17 <u>(f) Expiration.--This section shall expire July 15, 2024</u> <--
- 18 2026.
- 19 Section 10.1. Continuing county probation and parole grants.
- 20 (a) General rule. -- A county that provides adult probation
- 21 staff shall receive grant funding from the Commonwealth through
- 22 the commission for costs incurred by the county but only to the
- 23 extent that the staff and program meet the qualifications and
- 24 standards established by the commission.
- 25 (b) Appropriation.--
- 26 (1) For fiscal years $\frac{2020-2021}{}$, 2021-2022, 2022-2023 <-
- 27 and, 2023-2024, 2024-2025 AND 2025-2026, the sum of <--
- 28 \$16,222,000 PLUS THE AMOUNT DEPOSITED UNDER SECTION 9.1(C) AS <--
- 29 SAVINGS IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR shall be appropriated to the
- 30 commission for the purpose of formula funding to county

1	<u>probation and parole departments, as advised by the County</u>
2	Adult Probation and Parole Advisory Committee under section
3	<u>6.1.</u>
4	(2) For fiscal year 2024 2025, the sum of \$16,222,000 <
5	plus 90% of the amount determined to be savings in the prior
6	fiscal year shall be appropriated to the commission for the
7	purpose of formula funding to county probation and parole
8	departments, as advised by the County Adult Probation and
9	Parole Advisory Committee under section 6.1.
10	(3) (2) Beginning in fiscal year 2025 2026 2026-2027 and <
11	annually thereafter, the Commonwealth shall adjust the PRIOR <
12	YEAR'S appropriation to reflect the annual percentage change
13	in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers,
14	published by the United States Department of Commerce, Bureau
15	of Labor Statistics, occurring in the one-year period ending
16	on January 1 immediately preceding July 1.
17	(4) (3) If insufficient funds are appropriated, each <
18	county shall receive a prorated reduction in funding.
19	Section 10.2. County intermediate punishment funding.
20	The State appropriation for county intermediate punishment
21	shall continue to be utilized to support programs under 42
22	Pa.C.S. Ch. 98 (relating to county intermediate punishment).
23	Section 2. Repeals are as follows:
24	(1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under
25	paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of
26	section 6.1 of the act.
27	(2) 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 is repealed.
28	Section 3. Transfers shall be effectuated as follows:
29	(1) The functions, personnel, allocations,
30	appropriations, equipment, supplies, records, contracts,

	rights and obligations of the country flobation officers
2	Firearm Education and Training Commission are transferred to
3	the County Adult Probation and Parole Advisory Committee. The
4	transfer under this paragraph has the same effect as if the
5	subjects of transfer had originally been those of the County
6	Adult Probation and Parole Advisory Committee.
7	(2) Personnel transferred under paragraph (1) shall
8	retain the same employment status held prior to transfer.
9	This paragraph includes:
10	(i) Civil service classification.
11	(ii) Seniority.
12	(iii) Benefits.
13	(iv) Perquisites.
14	(3) Activities initiated under 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 shall
15	continue and remain in full force and effect and may be
16	completed under section 6.1 of the act.
17	(4) Orders, regulations, rules and decisions which were
18	made under 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 and which are in effect on the
19	effective date of section 2(2) of this act shall remain in
20	full force and effect until revoked, vacated or modified
21	under section 6.1 of the act.
22	(5) Contracts, obligations and collective bargaining
23	agreements entered into under 61 Pa.C.S. Ch. 63 are not
24	affected nor impaired by repeals under this act.
25	Section 4. A reference in a statute or regulation to the
26	County Probation Officers' Firearm Education and Training
27	Commission shall be deemed a reference to the County Adult
28	Probation and Parole Advisory Committee.
29	Section 5 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
