- 15 (a) General rule. -- If a urine drug screening is conducted in
- 16 <u>a general acute care hospital to assist in diagnosing a</u>
- 17 patient's condition, the urine drug screening shall include
- 18 <u>testing for fentanyl</u>.
- 19 (b) Reporting.--If the urine drug screening conducted in

- 1 accordance with subsection (a) detects fentanyl, the hospital
- 2 shall report the test results, which shall be deidentified, to
- 3 the Department of Health through PA-NEDSS.
- 4 (c) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall preclude an
- 5 <u>acute care hospital without analyzer equipment for urinalysis</u>
- 6 from utilizing fentanyl test strips in accordance with the act
- 7 of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled
- 8 <u>Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.</u>
- 9 (d) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 10 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 11 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 <u>"Acute care hospital." A facility that provides inpatient</u>
- 13 and outpatient hospital services and is licensed by the
- 14 Department of Health as a general or tertiary care hospital. The
- 15 <u>term does not include a specialty hospital.</u>
- 16 <u>"Controlled substance." A drug, substance or immediate</u>
- 17 precursor included in Schedules I through V of The Controlled
- 18 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 19 "PA-NEDSS." Pennsylvania's version of the National
- 20 Electronic Disease Surveillance System.
- 21 "Urine drug screening." A chemical analysis intended to test
- 22 a patient for the presence of a controlled substance.
- 23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
