AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 commissions shall be determined, "further providing for the composition of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission and their 21 22 terms and increasing their compensation.
- 23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 24 hereby enacts as follows:
- 25 Section 1. Section 469 and clause (6) of section 923, act of
- 26 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The Administrative
- 27 Code of 1929, added July 31, 1968 (P.L.754, No.235), are

- 1 amended to read:
- 2 Section 469. Pennsylvania Crime Commission.--(a) The
- 3 Pennsylvania Crime Commission shall consist of [four] <u>five</u>
- 4 commissioners [to be appointed by the Governor and the Attorney
- 5 General as chairman.] one to be appointed by the Speaker of the
- 6 House of Representatives, one to be appointed by the President
- 7 Pro Tempore of the Senate, one to be appointed by the Governor,
- 8 one to be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court,
- 9 and one to be appointed by the President Judge of the Superior
- 10 Court, none of whom shall be an elected or appointed official or
- 11 <u>an employe of the Commonwealth or any of its political</u>
- 12 <u>subdivisions</u>. The commission shall elect a chairman who shall
- 13 serve at the pleasure of the commission.
- 14 (b) [The Governor shall appoint all of the commissioners,
- 15 within thirty days of the effective date of this act. Two of the
- 16 commissioners shall be appointed to fill terms which will expire
- 17 on July 1 of the next even numbered year. Two of the
- 18 commissioners shall be appointed to fill terms which will expire
- 19 on July 1 of the next odd numbered year. The Governor shall then
- 20 appoint commissioners to fill the expired terms with two year
- 21 appointments.] Appointments to fill vacancies existing on the
- 22 <u>effective date of this amendatory act or vacancies created by</u>
- 23 this amendatory act shall be filled within thirty days by the
- 24 appointing authorities in the order enumerated in subsection (a)
- 25 of this section to terms which shall expire on July 1, 1978.
- 26 Appointments to fill expired terms shall be made in the same
- 27 sequence for four-year terms. Vacancies in unexpired terms shall
- 28 be made by the appropriate appointing authority for the
- 29 <u>remainder of the unexpired term.</u> Each commissioner may be
- 30 appointed for more than one term. Commissioners shall receive

- 1 [fifty dollars (\$50)] one hundred dollars (\$100) a day
- 2 compensation for their services.
- 3 (c) The [chairman] commission shall appoint and fix the
- 4 compensation of an executive director. The executive director
- 5 shall devote his full time to the general supervision of all
- 6 investigations and proceedings by the commission.
- 7 (d) The [chairman] <u>commission</u> may appoint such other
- 8 employes as [he] it may from time to time find necessary for the
- 9 proper performance of the functions of the commission. The
- 10 salaries of the other employes shall be fixed by the [chairman.]
- 11 commission.
- 12 (e) The expenses incurred by the commissioners, executive
- 13 director or other employes of the commission shall be allowed
- 14 and paid on the presentation of itemized vouchers therefor, and
- 15 approved by the commission, in the same manner and procedure as
- 16 Department of Justice employes.
- 17 Section 923. Pennsylvania Crime Commission.--The
- 18 Pennsylvania Crime Commission shall have power and its duty
- 19 shall be:
- 20 * * *
- 21 (6) To make a detailed written report to the General
- 22 Assembly and the Attorney General of every completed
- 23 investigation which may include recommendation for legislative
- 24 or administrative action.
- 25 * * *
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1975 and the
- 27 term of any commissioner who is in conflict with the provisions
- 28 of this act shall expire on that date.
