## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, by making it a crime to trespass on grounds of State institutions.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 18, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707,
7	No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes,
8	amended December 6, 1972 (P.L.1482, No.334), is amended by
9	adding a section to read:
10	§ 3504. Trespassing on grounds of State institutions.
11	(a) Definitions
12	(1) The term "State institution," as used in this
13	section, includes all penal, reformatory, or correctional
14	institutions, hospitals for the insane, or any institution
15	for feeble-minded or epileptic persons, for inebriates, or
16	for juvenile delinquents and dependents, and all school
17	districts or authorities and educational institutions

receiving appropriated moneys from the Commonwealth, and all

- 1 charitable institutions whatsoever, within this Commonwealth,
- 2 <u>maintained in whole or in part by the Commonwealth, and whose</u>
- 3 <u>boards of inspectors, managers, trustees or directors are,</u>
- 4 <u>respectively</u>, appointed by elected officers or officials or
- 5 <u>are elected officials.</u>
- 6 (2) The term "property" as used in this section includes
- 7 <u>all buildings, structures and land owned or leased by State</u>
- 8 institutions.
- 9 (3) The term "enter or remain unlawfully" means to enter
- or remain upon property without license or privilege to do
- 11 so. A person who enters or remains in or upon property which
- is at the time open to the public does so with license and
- privilege unless he fails or refuses to obey an order not to
- 14 <u>enter or remain, personally communicated to him or publicly</u>
- announced, by a person authorized to give such order. A
- license or privilege to enter or remain on property which is
- only partly open to the public is not a license or privilege
- 18 to enter or remain in any part of the property which is not
- 19 open to the public.
- 20 (b) Offense defined. -- A person commits an offense if he
- 21 wilfully enters or remains unlawfully upon property of State
- 22 institutions.
- 23 (c) Grading.--An offense under this section shall be a
- 24 <u>summary offense</u>.
