## AN ACT

- Authorizing the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to 2 acquire by gift on behalf of the Commonwealth the real property connected with the Fort Hunter Museum in Susquehanna 3 Township, Dauphin County, providing for its control,
- 5 management, supervision, restoration, improvement and
- maintenance; and receipt of certain funds in connection
- 7 therewith.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission
- 11 is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire, by gift, on
- 12 behalf of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the Fort Hunter
- 13 Museum and certain land connected thereto in Susquehanna
- 14 Township, Dauphin County.
- 15 Section 2. The title to the property shall be taken in the
- name of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, shall be free of all 16
- 17 liens and encumbrances and shall before its acceptance be
- 18 approved by the Department of Justice.
- 19 Section 3. Upon acquiring the title aforesaid, the
- 20 Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission shall be given

- 1 full control, management and supervision thereof, and shall have
- 2 power to adopt and carry into effect plans for the restoration,
- 3 improvement and maintenance of the property, and to make and
- 4 enforce rules and regulations for the preservation of the
- 5 property and the visitation thereof by the public.
- 6 Section 4. The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission
- 7 is hereby authorized to accept, in trust, as provided by law,
- 8 from the Fort Hunter Foundation and other interested entities or
- 9 individuals such moneys as they may present to the Commonwealth
- 10 to assist in the development of this property as a permanent
- 11 historical site.
- 12 Section 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
