8	Section 1. Short TitleThis act shall be known and may be	
9	cited as the "Pennsylvania Medical PHYSICIAN Education Planning	<—
10	Act."	
11	Section 2. Legislative FindingsThe Commonwealth of	
12	Pennsylvania is fortunate in the number and quality of medical	

13 schools located therein. However, there is no integrated system

of medical education FOR PHYSICIANS covering the entire State 1 which assures an appropriate distribution of physicians 2 3 throughout the Commonwealth. The lack of such an integrated 4 system results in a loss to both the medical schools and the 5 community at large. The medical schools are unable to take advantage of the various medical facilities and the talents of 6 7 individuals located throughout the Commonwealth. Many parts of the community at large are without sufficient health care while 8 those parts which do have health care cannot take advantage of 9 10 the advanced knowledge available at the medical schools. It is 11 essential that an integrated Statewide medical education plan FOR PHYSICIANS be developed for the benefit of both the medical 12 13 schools and the community at large.

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14 Section 3. Pennsylvania Medical PHYSICIAN Education 15 Council.--There is hereby created an independent council to be 16 known as the Pennsylvania Medical PHYSICIAN Education Council 17 which shall consist of the following persons: the Secretary of 18 Health and the Secretary of Education, or their respective 19 designees; the chief executive officers, or their designees, of the colleges or universities in Pennsylvania of which each 20 21 accredited medical school or school of osteopathy is a part; two 22 physicians licensed to practice in Pennsylvania who are 23 professionally qualified in a field of primary care appointed by 24 the Governor; one representative from a Pennsylvania teaching 25 hospital appointed by the Governor from a list of at least three 26 names submitted by the Council of Teaching Hospitals; two 27 members of the House of Representatives, one from each political 28 party, selected by the Speaker of the House; and two members of 29 the Senate, one from each political party selected by the 30 President pro tempore of the Senate. chairman from among its members. Members shall receive no
 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses
 incurred. The Secretary of Health shall provide the necessary
 administrative personnel and services. A quorum shall consist of
 a majority of the total membership of the council and a majority
 vote of those present shall be sufficient in the resolution of
 any matter.

8 Section 4. Powers and Duties of the Council.--The council 9 shall have the following powers and duties:

10 (1) Develop an integrated Statewide medical education plan <--
11 FOR PHYSICIANS which shall include the establishment of <--
12 residency programs in community hospitals by the medical schools
13 with the cooperation of the medical profession, hospitals, and
14 clinics throughout the Commonwealth.

15 (2) Divide the Commonwealth into regions and determine which
16 medical schools will operate in each region relative to the
17 implementation of such integrated Statewide medical plan.
18 (3) Give priority in the development of such an integrated
19 plan to those areas of the Commonwealth which have been
20 designated as medically deprived by the Secretary of Health.
21 (4) Cooperate with any agency or political subdivision of

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the Commonwealth or any other public or private agency in the development of such an integrated plan including the right to enter into contracts with such agencies and to receive monetary aid or grants.

26 (5) Cooperate with the office of the Governor or any 27 designated agency in the establishment of a Statewide 28 communication system which will enable the medical profession, 29 hospitals, and clinics throughout the Commonwealth to have a 30 direct tie line and instantaneous communication with computer 19750H0546B2012 - 3 - banks and specialists at the medical schools and medical
 centers.

3 (6) Contract with such consultants as may be deemed4 necessary to carry out the provisions of this act.

5 Section 5. Regional Advisory Boards .-- In each region established by the council pursuant to clause (2) of section 4 6 7 of this act, there is hereby created a Regional Advisory Board 8 to the Pennsylvania Medical PHYSICIAN Education Council. Each such board shall consist of seven persons appointed by the 9 10 Governor: Four of whom shall be involved with the delivery of 11 health care; and three of whom shall not be involved with the delivery of health care and shall be consumer representatives. 12 13 Members of the board shall serve for a four year term except 14 those first appointed in which case; three shall be appointed 15 for a three year term; and four shall be appointed for a four 16 year term. Vacancies shall be made in the manner of the original 17 appointments for the remainder of the unexpired term. The 18 members of the board shall also represent a geographical balance 19 of the region. Members of each board shall select a chairman 20 from among its members and a majority of the members shall 21 constitute a quorum. A majority vote of those present shall be 22 sufficient in the resolution of any matter. The advisory boards 23 shall meet at least twice during each year. Members shall receive no compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual 24 25 expenses incurred.

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The function of each board shall be to act in an advisory capacity to the council relative to the unique problems existing in the board's region to enable the council to have the best available information in the performance of the council's duties.

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1 Section 6. Regulation of Certain Appropriations to Medical Schools and Schools of Osteopathy. --Whenever any Commonwealth 2 3 appropriation is made to any medical school or school of 4 osteopathy on a student per capita basis, such appropriation 5 shall be expended in the following manner unless otherwise specifically designated in the act making such appropriation: 6 7 Eighty per cent of such appropriation may be used at the (1)8 discretion of the medical school or school of osteopathy; 9 (2) Twenty per cent of the first such appropriation made 10 after the effective date of this act shall be used by the 11 medical school or school of osteopathy to create a fund from which loans are made to students. For each year thereafter, such 12 13 percentage of an appropriation shall first be used in an amount 14 which shall maintain such loan fund at an amount equal to twenty 15 per cent of the total appropriation for that year. Any amount 16 remaining after such maintenance of the loan fund may be used at the discretion of the medical school or school of osteopathy. 17 18 This loan program shall be administered either by the medical 19 school or school of osteopathy, or in the alternative, the 20 medical school or school of osteopathy shall have the power to 21 enter into an agreement with the Pennsylvania Higher Education 22 Assistance Agency for the purpose of the administration of such 23 loan program. Such agreement may provide for the payment of 24 costs of administration to such agency from the loan fund. The 25 Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency is hereby 26 authorized to enter into such agreements and to administer such 27 loan programs in accordance with the terms of such agreements 28 and the provisions of this act. Such loan program shall provide 29 that for each year a graduate practices in any area of the 30 Commonwealth designated as medically deprived by the Secretary - 5 -19750H0546B2012

of Health twenty per cent of the total of such loan shall be
 forgiven.

Section 7. Appropriation.--The sum of \$350,000, or as much
thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the
Pennsylvania Medical PHYSICIAN Education Council for the
purposes of this act. Every year thereafter, the General
Assembly shall appropriate that amount of funds as it deems
necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.
Section 8. Effective Date.--This act shall take effect

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
