## AN ACT

- 1 Providing plans for the encouragement of certain Vietnam
- 2 veterans to return to school to complete their secondary
- 3 education; imposing certain duties on the Department of
- 4 Education and each of the school districts of the
- 5 Commonwealth and making an appropriation.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Findings and Declaration of Policy. -- (a) Draft
- 9 policies during the Vietnam era resulted in large numbers of men
- 10 who had not finished their high school education being inducted
- 11 into the armed forces. Many of these men are still educationally
- 12 unqualified for responsible jobs or for higher education.
- 13 (b) The Vietnam G.I. Bill of Rights provides aid for these
- 14 men to attend secondary schools, but few of them have taken
- 15 advantage of the opportunity. This is at least partly due to the
- 16 lack of effort to seek out these veterans and to counsel them to
- 17 return to school. There also is a natural reluctance on the part

- 1 of many veterans to return to high school classes composed of
- 2 younger students.
- 3 (c) The General Assembly therefore declares it to be the
- 4 policy of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to provide secondary
- 5 education for as many of these veterans as possible.
- 6 (d) In furtherance of this policy of the Department of
- 7 Education and each of the school districts of the Commonwealth
- 8 are directed to enlarge and extend their efforts to encourage
- 9 these veterans to return to school by using such programs as
- 10 "outreach" and also by providing special classes both night and
- 11 day, in areas in which there are sufficient veterans to form
- 12 such classes.
- 13 Section 2. Definition. -- For purposes of this act, "qualified
- 14 veteran" means any veteran who:
- 15 (1) Served on active duty for a period of more than one
- 16 hundred eighty days and part of which was accrued after August
- 17 5, 1964, and who was discharged or released therefrom under
- 18 conditions other than dishonorable; and .
- 19 (2) Was a resident of Pennsylvania for at least one year
- 20 immediately preceding his service on active duty, has continued

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- 21 to reside in Pennsylvania following his discharge or release
- 22 from active duty and continues to reside in Pennsylvania during
- 23 the period in which he is enrolled in refresher courses or
- 24 deficiency courses in the case of any veteran who has not
- 25 received a secondary school diploma (or an equivalent) at the
- 26 time of his discharge from active duty, or who is enrolled for
- 27 additional secondary school training to qualify for admission to
- 28 a program of post-secondary education at a post-secondary
- 29 institution, or to obtain a secondary school diploma to meet
- 30 requirements for employment.

- 1 Section 3. Duties of the Department of Education. -- It shall
- 2 be the duty of the Department of Education to formulate plans
- 3 designed to reach as many qualified veterans as possible who did
- 4 not finish high school. Further, the Department of Education
- 5 shall coordinate any such plans with the local school districts
- 6 and shall furnish such school districts with any brochures,
- 7 educational material and similar aids developed to help such
- 8 school districts carry out the policy enunciated in section one
- 9 of this act.
- 10 Section 4. Duties of Local School Districts.--Each local
- 11 school district shall cooperate with the Department of Education
- 12 in the furtherance of plans developed by the Department of
- 13 Education pursuant to section 3. Further, each local school
- 14 district shall prepare plans for the secondary education of
- 15 qualified veterans residing within such districts. Such plans
- 16 shall be forwarded to the Department of Education for approval.
- 17 Section 5. Reimbursement.--(a) Whenever the plan of a local
- 18 school district for the education of qualified veterans requires
- 19 special classes, either night or day to be held for such
- 20 veterans and such plan has been approved by the Department of
- 21 Education, such school district shall be reimbursed by the
- 22 Commonwealth one hundred per cent of the sum which was expended
- 23 by the district for the compensation of teachers and supervisors
- 24 employed for such special classes. For the purpose of computing
- 25 reimbursement, the maximum compensation shall be \$5.00 per hour
- 26 and the amount expended for supervisory salaries shall not
- 27 exceed 20% of the sum expended for teachers' salaries: Provided,
- 28 That in special cases when travel time or unusual preparation of
- 29 instructional materials or other factors result in an inadequate
- 30 compensation, the Department of Education may approve additional

- 1 reimbursable employment time for such additional services upon
- 2 the submission of adequate substantive evidence from the
- 3 responsible superintendent of schools. In addition, such school
- 4 district shall be reimbursed for the cost of any books, supplies
- 5 and educational aids used exclusively for such special classes.
- 6 (b) The amount due each school district shall be divided
- 7 into quarterly installments and the Secretary of Education shall
- 8 draw his requisition quarterly upon the State Treasurer in favor
- 9 of each district for the amount to which it is entitled. The
- 10 first three quarterly payments shall be estimates based on but
- 11 not to exceed twenty-five per cent each of the estimated total
- 12 cost of the approved plan. The final quarterly payment shall be
- 13 the balance of the actual allowable cost to such school
- 14 district. Payment thereof shall be made to all school districts
- 15 during the months of August, November, February and May of each
- 16 year.
- 17 Section 6. Federal Funds. -- The Department of Education is
- 18 hereby designated the authorized agency of the Commonwealth to
- 19 receive and disburse any Federal Funds available for any of the
- 20 purposes of this act.
- 21 Section 7. Appropriation. -- The sum of \$50,000 or as much
- 22 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the
- 23 Department of Education for use in carrying out the purposes of
- 24 this act.
- 25 Section 8. Effective Date. -- This act shall take effect
- 26 immediately.
