AN ACT

1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
2 act relating to the public school system, including certain
3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
5 laws relating thereto," further providing for intermediate
6 unit board of directors.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. Subsection (a), of section 910-A, act of March
10 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the "Public School Code of
11 1949," added May 4, 1970 (P.L.311, No.102), is amended to read:

12 Section 910-A. Intermediate Unit Board of Directors.--(a)
13 Each intermediate unit board of directors shall be composed of
14 at least thirteen members, chosen for terms of three years from
15 among members of the boards of school directors of school
16 districts comprising the intermediate unit. An intermediate unit
17 director may succeed himself for two additional terms. Unless
18 there are fewer than thirteen school districts in an
19 intermediate unit, at no time shall more than one director from
20 any school district be elected to an intermediate unit board of

1 directors. Where there are fewer than thirteen school districts
2 within an intermediate unit, there shall be at least one school
3 director from each school district elected to the intermediate
4 unit board of directors. When there are more than thirteen
5 districts in an intermediate unit each district, as far as
6 practicable, shall have one member on the unit board, up to a
7 maximum of twenty members. The election of intermediate unit
8 boards of directors shall be by proportionate ballot, and each
9 school director of each school district within an intermediate
10 unit shall be entitled to cast votes determined by dividing the
11 weighted average daily membership of the school district by the
12 total weighted average daily membership within the intermediate
13 unit, multiplying the quotient so obtained by one thousand,
14 dividing the product so obtained by thirteen, and rounding such
15 dividend to the nearest whole number: Provided, however, That
16 each school director shall have at least one vote. The
17 Superintendent of Public Instruction shall annually, not later
18 than the first day of February, certify the weighted average
19 daily membership for the previous school year for each school
20 district and for each intermediate unit, and shall compute the
21 number of votes to which each school director of each school
22 district within an intermediate unit shall be entitled.
