In the House of Representatives, February 3, 1976

- 1 WHEREAS, Terrorist acts are occurring with greater frequency
- 2 at public transportation terminals and facilities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Such acts have resulted in the loss of life and
- 4 serious injury; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Such acts are likely to continue in the foreseeable
- 6 future; and
- 7 WHEREAS, During the Bicentennial year, the facilities will be
- 8 accommodating large numbers of visitors to the Commonwealth; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Such acts attack the capacity of the emergency
- 10 systems needed to respond to such scenes; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 12 appoint a bipartisan committee of nine members, five from the
- 13 majority party and four from the minority party, to investigate
- 14 security and safety at public transportation terminals and
- 15 facilities; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That the committee may hold hearings, take
- 17 testimony, and make its investigation at such places as it deems

- 1 necessary within this Commonwealth. It may issue subpoenas under
- 2 the hand and seal of its chairman commanding any person to
- 3 appear before it and to answer questions touching matters
- 4 properly being inquired into by the committee and to produce
- 5 such books, papers, records and documents as the committee deems
- 6 necessary. Such subpoenas may be served upon any person and
- 7 shall have the force and effect of subpoenas issued out of the
- 8 courts of this Commonwealth. Any person who wilfully neglects or
- 9 refuses to testify before the committee or to produce any books,
- 10 papers, records or documents, shall be subject to the penalties
- 11 provided by the laws of the Commonwealth in such case. Each
- 12 member of the committee shall have power to administer oaths and
- 13 affirmations to witnesses appearing before the committee; and be
- 14 it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That within thirty calendar days after the
- 16 committee has made its report, the chairman of the committee
- 17 shall cause a record of all expenses incurred by the committee,
- 18 or the members thereof, which are payable at Commonwealth
- 19 expense, to be filed with the Speaker of the House and the
- 20 Speaker shall cause the same to be entered in the journal
- 21 thereof. No expenses incurred by the committee or any member
- 22 thereof shall be reimbursable by the Chief Clerk unless such
- 23 expense shall first have been included as an expense item in the
- 24 record heretofore required; and be it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the committee report its findings to the
- 26 General Assembly as soon as possible.
