## AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, authorizing the use in clubs of games of chance registered with the Department of Revenue and 3 providing for their registration upon payment of an annual registration fee, and tax, to be paid into the State Lottery Fund for the purpose of providing property tax relief for the 7 elderly and local transit for the elderly. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Section 5513 of Title 18, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated 11 12 Statutes, is amended by adding subsections to read: 13 § 5513. Gambling devices, gambling, etc. 14 15 (c) Exception. -- Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to 16 games of chance which are registered in accordance with subsection (d) for use by clubs on premises occupied by such 17 18 clubs.
- 19 <u>(d) Registration of games of chance.--A game of chance</u>
- 20 machine shall be registered with the Pennsylvania Department of

- 1 Revenue upon payment of an annual registration fee of \$500, the
- 2 payment of which shall be evidenced by a registration stamp
- 3 <u>issued</u> by the department and affixed to the game of chance
- 4 machine. Registration shall be for a calendar year and fees for
- 5 initial registration filed during a calendar year shall be
- 6 reduced to an amount proportionate to the number of months
- 7 remaining in the year. The department shall adopt forms and
- 8 procedures for application for registration stamps except that,
- 9 <u>in addition to other requirements of the department, the</u>
- 10 application for registration shall contain the name of the
- 11 manufacturer and the name and address of the owner of the game
- 12 of chance machine and the registration stamp shall contain the
- 13 <u>serial or other identification number of the game of chance</u>
- 14 machine and the registration expiration date. The fees collected
- 15 by the Department of Revenue shall be paid into the State
- 16 Lottery Fund and shall be allocated for the purpose of providing
- 17 property tax relief for the elderly pursuant to the provisions
- 18 of the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the
- 19 "Senior Citizens Property Tax or Rent Rebate Act," and for the
- 20 purpose of providing local transit for the elderly pursuant to
- 21 the act of January 22, 1968 (P.L.42, No.8), known as the
- 22 "Pennsylvania Urban Mass Transportation Assistance Law of 1967."
- 23 (e) Imposition of tax.--There is hereby imposed a tax of 15%
- 24 of the net profits realized on each game of chance machine. This
- 25 tax shall be paid into the State Lottery Fund for the purpose of
- 26 providing property tax relief for the elderly pursuant to the
- 27 provisions of the "Senior Citizens Property Tax or Rent Rebate
- 28 Act, " and for the purpose of local transit of the elderly
- 29 <u>pursuant to the "Pennsylvania Urban Mass Transportation</u>
- 30 Assistance Law of 1967."

- 1 (f) Ownership and operation.--All games of chance machines
- 2 shall be owned, or leased and operated by clubs.
- 3 (g) Definitions.--The following words and phrases when used
- 4 <u>in this section shall have, unless the context clearly indicates</u>
- 5 otherwise, the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 6 <u>"Club." A nonprofit corporation, association, society,</u>
- 7 organization or other nonprofit group of individuals associated
- 8 together for legitimate purposes of mutual benefits,
- 9 <u>entertainment</u>, <u>fellowship</u>, <u>pleasure</u>, <u>recreation</u> <u>or lawful</u>
- 10 convenience having some primary interest and activity to which
- 11 the use of game of chance machines shall be secondary and which
- 12 regularly occupies, as owner or lessee, a clubhouse or quarters
- 13 for the use of its members, and which is licensed by the
- 14 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.
- "Game of chance machine." Any electronically or mechanically
- 16 <u>coin-operated machine or device manufactured after 1965</u>, which
- 17 is encased in an upright cabinet and is operated by the
- 18 insertion of a coin or token into the slot and is activated by a
- 19 handle, lever or button. The machine generally has three or more
- 20 reels which contain numerous symbols and each symbol must have a
- 21 stop mechanism to position the symbols to appear on the win
- 22 line. The various combinations of these symbols determine the
- 23 payout. Each reel is visible to the player. The machine can be a
- 24 <u>multiple coin or token machine and each payout is increased</u>
- 25 equally by the number of coins or tokens inserted. The machine
- 26 <u>shall have a computer attachment recording the number of coins</u>
- 27 received and the number of coins returned to the player.
- 28 Section 2. All acts and parts of acts, general, local and
- 29 special, are repealed insofar as they prohibit the use of games
- 30 of chance machines in clubs when such games of chance machines

- 1 are registered in accordance with the provisions of 18 Pa.C.S. §
- 2 5513 (relating to gambling devices, gambling, etc.).
- Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 3
