AN ACT

- Requiring criminal trials to commence within 180 days from the 1 2 date of arrest.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. (a) Trial in a court case in which the defendant
- is arrested after September 1, 1977, shall commence no later 6
- 7 than 180 days from the date on which the arrest of the defendant
- 8 took place.
- 9 (b) For the purpose of this act, trial shall be deemed to
- 10 commence on the date the trial judge calls the case to trial.
- (c) At any time before trial, the defendant or his attorney 11
- 12 may apply to the court for an order dismissing the charges with
- prejudice on the ground that this act has been violated. A copy 13
- 14 of such application shall be served upon the attorney for the
- 15 Commonwealth, who shall have the right to be heard thereon. Any
- order granting such application shall dismiss the charges with 16
- prejudice and discharge the defendant. 17
- 18 (d) Nothing in this act shall be construed to modify any

- 1 time limit contained in any statute of limitations.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
