## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 7 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 8 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 12 13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 15 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 16 authorizing the sale by clubs of malt or brewed beverages for 17 18 off premises consumption. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 20 21 Section 407, act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, 22 No.21), known as the "Liquor Code," is amended to read: 23 Section 407. Sale of Malt or Brewed Beverages by Liquor 24 Licensees. -- Every liquor license issued to a hotel, restaurant, club, or a railroad, pullman or steamship company under this 25

subdivision (A) for the sale of liquor shall authorize the

- 1 licensee to sell malt or brewed beverages at the same places but
- 2 subject to the same restrictions and penalties as apply to sales
- 3 of liquor, except that licensees [other than clubs] may sell
- 4 malt or brewed beverages for consumption off the premises where
- 5 sold in quantities of not more than one hundred forty-four fluid
- 6 ounces in a single sale to one person. No licensee under this
- 7 subdivision (A) shall at the the same time be the holder of any
- 8 other class of license, except a retail dispenser's license
- 9 authorizing the sale of malt or brewed beverages only.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
