AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, changing the statute of
- 3 limitations for certain offenses.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Subsection (c) of section 5552 of Title 42, act
- 7 of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the
- 8 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, is amended to read:
- 9 § 5552. Other offenses.
- 10 * * *
- 11 (c) Exceptions.--If the period prescribed in subsection (a)
- 12 or subsection (b) has expired, a prosecution may nevertheless be
- 13 commenced for:
- 14 (1) Any offense a material element of which is either
- fraud or a breach of fiduciary obligation within one year

- after discovery of the offense by an aggrieved party or by a
- 2 person who has a legal duty to represent an aggrieved party
- and who is himself not a party to the offense, but in no case
- 4 shall this paragraph extend the period of limitation
- 5 otherwise applicable by more than three years.
- 6 (2) Any offense committed by a public officer or
- 7 employee in the course of or in connection with his office or
- 8 employment at any time when the defendant is in public office
- 9 or employment or within [two] <u>five</u> years thereafter, but in
- 10 no case shall this paragraph extend the period of limitation
- otherwise applicable by more than [three] ten years.

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
