HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 115 Session of 1977

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON RULES, JUNE 15, 1977

In the House of Representatives, June 14, 1977 WHEREAS, Despite recent gains in the economy Pennsylvania is still a job-short area; and

3 WHEREAS, The shortage of employment has a devastating effect 4 on those without jobs, depriving them of their dignity as well as the means of supporting themselves and their families; and 5 б WHEREAS, In addition, State and local governmental units are deprived of tax revenue when there is a shortage of jobs and the 7 8 costs of government constantly rise because of the additional 9 demands on welfare and unemployment compensation; and 10 WHEREAS, The recent decision of Volkswagen to locate a plant 11 in Pennsylvania demonstrates that fundamentally the Keystone State has the natural resources, a skilled labor force with a 12 13 desire to work and public officials who want to coordinate their 14 efforts at producing work for the people; and 15 WHEREAS, The problems associated with the location of 16 Volkswagen also demonstrated that the myriad layers of 17 Pennsylvania government, with their many laws, rules and

regulations, sometimes hamper the attraction of new industry,
with new jobs for Pennsylvania; and

3 WHEREAS, It is the desire of the House of Representatives of 4 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania that the Joint State Government Commission undertake a study to determine how a single agency 5 can be established to coordinate the efforts of all 6 Pennsylvanians to attract jobs; now therefore be it 7 8 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission be directed to study the problems faced by new industries wishing 9 to locate in Pennsylvania, particularly those that are caused by 10 11 a lack of cooperation between units of local and State government; and that the Joint State Government Commission 12 13 produce a plan under which a single agency would coordinate the 14 efforts of all Pennsylvanians to attract jobs; and be it further RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission 15 16 recommend changes in the law that will permit such agency to 17 function effectively; and be it further 18 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission report 19 its findings as soon as possible, but provide a preliminary

20 report not later than December 31, 1977, along with drafts of 21 legislation necessary to carry out the measures recommended. The 22 commission shall make a final report not later than June 1, 23 1978.
