AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto, " further providing for work to be done 5 under contract let on bids, and making an editorial change, б AND REQUIRING ANNUAL REPORTS; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC 7 SCHOOL SUBSIDIES; AND REPEALING CERTAIN PROVISIONS. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 751, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, 12 No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended October 4, 1978 (P.L.1040, No.236), is amended AND THE ACT IS 13 14 AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION to read: Section 751. 15 Work to be Done Under Contract Let on Bids; 16 Exception.--(a) All construction, reconstruction, repairs, 17 <u>maintenance</u> or work of any nature, including the introduction of 18 plumbing, heating and ventilating, or lighting systems, upon any school building or upon any school property, or upon any 19

building or portion of a building leased under the provisions of 1 section 703.1, made by any school district, where the entire 2 3 cost, value, or amount of such construction, reconstruction, 4 repairs, <u>maintenance</u> or work, including labor and material, shall exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or the 5 <award of any contract including personal service contracts to 6 7 any person or entity, other than an employe, in connection with 8 the maintenance of school buildings or other school property, or any building or portion of a building leased under the 9 10 provisions of section 703.1, shall be done under separate 11 contracts to be entered into by such school district with the lowest responsible bidder, upon proper terms, after due public 12 13 notice has been given asking for competitive bids. Whenever a 14 board of school directors shall approve the use of a 15 prefabricated unit, complete in itself, for a school building or 16 other proper structure to be erected upon school property, the 17 board of school directors may have prepared appropriate 18 specifications detailing the size and material desired in a particular prefabricated unit, including all utilities such as 19 20 plumbing, heating and ventilating, and electrical work, and may 21 advertise for a single bid on all the work and award the 22 contract therefor to the lowest responsible bidder: Provided, 23 That if due to an emergency a school plant or any part thereof 24 becomes unusable competitive bids for repairs or replacement may 25 be solicited from at least three responsible bidders, and upon 26 the approval of any of these bids by the Secretary of Education, 27 the board of school directors may proceed at once to make the necessary repairs or replacements in accordance with the terms 28 29 of said approved bid or bids.

30 (b) The board of school directors in any school district 19790H0140B1837 - 2 -

either may perform any construction, reconstruction, repairs, or 1 2 work of any nature, where the entire cost or value, including 3 labor and material, is less than five thousand dollars (\$5000), 4 by its own maintenance personnel, or may have any such 5 construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work performed by contract after soliciting bids from at least three responsible 6 bidders: Provided, That the board of school directors in any 7 school district may authorize the secretary of the board or 8 9 other executive to award contracts for construction, 10 reconstruction, repairs, or work of any nature, where the entire 11 cost or value, including labor and material, is two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or less, without soliciting 12 13 competitive bids.

14 (c) Every contract for the construction, reconstruction, 15 alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works 16 shall comply with the provisions of the act of March 3, 1978 17 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the "Steel Products Procurement Act." 18 (d) The board of school directors of any school district may, in addition to the power granted in subsection (b), utilize 19 20 also its own maintenance or other personnel to perform 21 maintenance work irrespective of the entire cost or value of 22 such work. 23 SECTION 2013. PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF TRANSPORTATION OF 11 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS. -- EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, REGARDLESS OF 12 CLASSIFICATION, SHALL BE PAID BY THE COMMONWEALTH THE SUM OF 13 TWENTY DOLLARS (\$20) FOR EACH NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TRANSPORTED 14 IN THE SCHOOL YEAR 1978-1979 AND EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER. 15 SECTION 7. SECTION 16, ACT OF AUGUST 24, 1977 (P.L.199, 16 NO.59), ENTITLED "AN ACT AMENDING THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 17 (P.L.30, NO.14), ENTITLED 'AN ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL 18 SYSTEM, INCLUDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS APPLICABLE AS WELL TO 19 PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS; AMENDING, REVISING, CONSOLIDATING 20 AND CHANGING THE LAWS RELATING THERETO, ' CHANGING AND ADDING 21 DEFINITIONS; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR SUBSIDIES, INSTRUCTIONAL 22 MATERIALS, TEXTBOOKS AND MODIFIED SPARSITY PAYMENTS; PROVIDING 23 FOR CLASSES AND PROGRAMS FOR CERTAIN EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN; AND 24 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFACING, INJURING OR DESTROYING SCHOOL 25 PROPERTY," IS REPEALED.
