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AN ACT

1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An  
2 act relating to the public school system, including certain  
3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial  
4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the  
5 laws relating thereto," further providing for work to be done  
6 under contract let on bids, ~~and~~ making an editorial change, <—  
7 ~~AND~~ REQUIRING ANNUAL REPORTS; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR PUBLIC <—  
8 SCHOOL SUBSIDIES; AND REPEALING CERTAIN PROVISIONS.

9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
10 hereby enacts as follows:

11 Section 1. Section 751, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,  
12 No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended  
13 October 4, 1978 (P.L.1040, No.236), is amended AND THE ACT IS <—  
14 AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION to read:

15 Section 751. Work to be Done Under Contract Let on Bids;  
16 Exception.--(a) All construction, reconstruction, repairs,  
17 maintenance or work of any nature, including the introduction of  
18 plumbing, heating and ventilating, or lighting systems, upon any  
19 school building or upon any school property, or upon any

1 building or portion of a building leased under the provisions of  
2 section 703.1, made by any school district, where the entire  
3 cost, value, or amount of such construction, reconstruction,  
4 repairs, maintenance or work, including labor and material,  
5 shall exceed two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), ~~or the~~ <—  
6 ~~award of any contract including personal service contracts to~~  
7 ~~any person or entity, other than an employe, in connection with~~  
8 ~~the maintenance of school buildings or other school property, or~~  
9 ~~any building or portion of a building leased under the~~  
10 ~~provisions of section 703.1,~~ shall be done under separate  
11 contracts to be entered into by such school district with the  
12 lowest responsible bidder, upon proper terms, after due public  
13 notice has been given asking for competitive bids. Whenever a  
14 board of school directors shall approve the use of a  
15 prefabricated unit, complete in itself, for a school building or  
16 other proper structure to be erected upon school property, the  
17 board of school directors may have prepared appropriate  
18 specifications detailing the size and material desired in a  
19 particular prefabricated unit, including all utilities such as  
20 plumbing, heating and ventilating, and electrical work, and may  
21 advertise for a single bid on all the work and award the  
22 contract therefor to the lowest responsible bidder: Provided,  
23 That if due to an emergency a school plant or any part thereof  
24 becomes unusable competitive bids for repairs or replacement may  
25 be solicited from at least three responsible bidders, and upon  
26 the approval of any of these bids by the Secretary of Education,  
27 the board of school directors may proceed at once to make the  
28 necessary repairs or replacements in accordance with the terms  
29 of said approved bid or bids.

30 (b) The board of school directors in any school district

1 either may perform any construction, reconstruction, repairs, or  
2 work of any nature, where the entire cost or value, including  
3 labor and material, is less than five thousand dollars (\$5000),  
4 by its own maintenance personnel, or may have any such  
5 construction, reconstruction, repairs, or work performed by  
6 contract after soliciting bids from at least three responsible  
7 bidders: Provided, That the board of school directors in any  
8 school district may authorize the secretary of the board or  
9 other executive to award contracts for construction,  
10 reconstruction, repairs, or work of any nature, where the entire  
11 cost or value, including labor and material, is two thousand  
12 five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or less, without soliciting  
13 competitive bids.

14 (c) Every contract for the construction, reconstruction,  
15 alteration, repair, improvement or maintenance of public works  
16 shall comply with the provisions of the act of March 3, 1978  
17 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the "Steel Products Procurement Act."

18 (d) The board of school directors of any school district  
19 may, in addition to the power granted in subsection (b), utilize  
20 also its own maintenance or other personnel to perform  
21 maintenance work irrespective of the entire cost or value of  
22 such work.

23 SECTION 2013. ANNUAL REPORTS.--(A) AN ANNUAL REPORT SHALL <—  
24 BE SUBMITTED BY EACH STATE COLLEGE AND STATE-OWNED UNIVERSITY TO  
25 THE GOVERNOR AND THE APPROPRIATIONS AND EDUCATION COMMITTEES OF  
26 THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES WHICH SHALL INCLUDE DATA  
27 FOR ALL PROGRAMS OF THE STATE COLLEGE OR STATE-OWNED UNIVERSITY.  
28 EACH SUCH REPORT, TO BE SUBMITTED PRIOR TO OCTOBER 1, SHALL  
29 COVER THE 12-MONTH PERIOD BEGINNING SEPTEMBER 1 OF THE PRECEDING  
30 YEAR, AND SHALL INCLUDE FOR EACH TERM DURING THE PERIOD:

1       (1) THE FOLLOWING COUNTS AND DISTRIBUTIONS:

2       (I) THE DEFINITIONS AND NUMBERS OF FACULTY MEMBERS EMPLOYED  
3 FULL-TIME, OF FACULTY MEMBERS EMPLOYED PART TIME, OF FULL TIME  
4 STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GRADUATE COURSES, OF FULL TIME STUDENTS  
5 ENROLLED IN UNDERGRADUATE COURSES, OF PART TIME STUDENTS  
6 ENROLLED IN GRADUATE COURSES, AND OF PART TIME STUDENTS ENROLLED  
7 IN UNDERGRADUATE COURSES.

8       (II) A DISTRIBUTION OF FACULTY MEMBERS EMPLOYED PART TIME BY  
9 THE PERCENTAGE OF FULL TIME EMPLOYMENT.

10       (III) TOTAL NUMBERS OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CREDIT HOURS,  
11 DIVIDED INTO LOWER DIVISION AND UPPER DIVISION COURSE LEVELS,  
12 AND OF GRADUATE STUDENT CREDIT HOURS DIVIDED INTO THREE COURSE  
13 LEVELS--MASTER'S, FIRST PROFESSIONAL AND DOCTORAL.

14       (IV) NUMBER OF DIFFERENT COURSES SCHEDULED BY LEVEL OF  
15 INSTRUCTION, AND THE NUMBER OF SECTIONS OF INDIVIDUAL  
16 INSTRUCTION AT EACH LEVEL OF INSTRUCTION.

17       (V) NUMBER OF TERMS SCHEDULED AND THE DATES THEREOF.

18       (2) TWO CLASSIFICATIONS: FIRST, A CLASSIFICATION OF FACULTY  
19 MEMBERS OR OTHER PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYES BY TITLE INCLUDING:  
20 PROFESSOR, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, INSTRUCTOR,  
21 LECTURER, RESEARCH ASSOCIATE, LIBRARIAN AND ACADEMIC  
22 ADMINISTRATOR; FACULTY MEMBERS OR OTHER PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYES  
23 UNDER EACH TITLE TO BE SUBDIVIDED BY TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT:  
24 INSTRUCTIONAL OR NONINSTRUCTIONAL DIVIDED INTO TEACHING AND  
25 NONTEACHING, AND EACH SUCH SET OF FACULTY MEMBERS OR OTHER  
26 PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYES TO BE FURTHER SUBDIVIDED BY TYPE OF  
27 EMPLOYMENT: FULL TIME OR PART TIME; AND SECOND, A CLASSIFICATION  
28 OF FACULTY MEMBERS AND OTHER PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYES BY SCHOOL AND  
29 DEPARTMENT TO BE SUBDIVIDED BY TYPE OF ASSIGNMENT: INSTRUCTIONAL  
30 OR NONINSTRUCTIONAL DIVIDED INTO TEACHING AND NONTEACHING, AND

EACH SUCH SET OF FACULTY MEMBERS OR OTHER PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES  
TO BE FURTHER SUBDIVIDED BY TYPE OF EMPLOYMENT: FULL TIME OR  
PART TIME; AND THE FOLLOWING AGGREGATES FOR EACH SUBDIVISION IN  
EACH CLASSIFICATION:

(I) THE NUMBER.

(II) THE SUM OF CREDITS ASSIGNED TO UNDERGRADUATE CLASSROOM  
COURSES AND THE SUM OF CREDITS ASSIGNED TO GRADUATE CLASSROOM  
COURSES TAUGHT, DIVIDED INTO LOWER DIVISION, UPPER DIVISION,  
MASTER'S, FIRST PROFESSIONAL AND DOCTORAL COURSE LEVELS.

(III) THE SUM OF UNDERGRADUATE CLASSROOM STUDENT CREDIT  
HOURS AND THE SUM OF GRADUATE CLASSROOM STUDENT CREDIT HOURS  
GENERATED; DIVIDED INTO LOWER DIVISION, UPPER DIVISION,  
MASTER'S, FIRST PROFESSIONAL AND DOCTORAL COURSE LEVELS.

(IV) THE SUM OF UNDERGRADUATE INDIVIDUAL INSTRUCTION STUDENT  
CREDIT HOURS AND THE SUM OF GRADUATE INDIVIDUAL INSTRUCTION  
STUDENT CREDIT HOURS GENERATED; DIVIDED INTO LOWER DIVISION,  
UPPER DIVISION, MASTER'S, FIRST PROFESSIONAL AND DOCTORAL COURSE  
LEVELS.

(V) TOTAL SALARY PAID.

(VI) TOTAL SALARY PAID FROM COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY FUNDS.

(VII) TOTAL SALARY PAID FROM FEDERAL FUNDS.

(VIII) TOTAL SALARY PAID FROM OTHER FUNDS.

(3) FOR EACH TERM OF THE PERIOD COVERED FOR EACH FACULTY  
MEMBER EMPLOYED FULL TIME IDENTIFIED BY SCHOOL, DEPARTMENT AND  
TITLE, THE REPORT SHALL CONTAIN AN ANALYSIS OF THE AVERAGE HOURS  
PER WEEK SPENT IN COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY-RELATED ACTIVITIES,  
STATING SPECIFICALLY HOURS SPENT IN UNDERGRADUATE CLASSROOM  
CONTACT AND GRADUATE CLASSROOM CONTACT, HOURS SPENT IN  
PREPARATION, HOURS SPENT IN RESEARCH AND HOURS SPENT IN PUBLIC  
SERVICE.

1     (B) IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (A), EACH  
2     REPORT COVERING THE 12-MONTH PERIOD SHALL INCLUDE FOR ALL  
3     PROGRAMS OF THE STATE COLLEGE OR STATE-OWNED UNIVERSITY:

4     (1) MINIMUM NUMBER OF CREDITS REQUIRED FOR A BACCALAUREATE  
5     DEGREE AND FOR A MASTER'S DEGREE.

6     (2) NUMBER OF BACHELOR'S DEGREES, MASTER'S DEGREES, FIRST  
7     PROFESSIONAL DEGREES, AND DOCTORAL DEGREES AWARDED IN THE THREE  
8     PREVIOUS YEARS AND THOSE ESTIMATED FOR THAT YEAR.

9     ~~Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.~~ <—

10    SECTION 2. CLAUSE (17.1) OF SECTION 2501 OF THE ACT, ADDED <—  
11    AUGUST 24, 1977 (P.L.199, NO.59), IS AMENDED TO READ:

12    SECTION 2501. DEFINITIONS.--FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE  
13    THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS:

15    (17.1) "BASE EARNED FOR REIMBURSEMENT." SHALL BE THE LESSER  
16    OF (A) THE ACTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPENSE PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY  
17    MEMBERSHIP OF THE DISTRICT, OR (B) THE AMOUNT EARNED AS FOLLOWS:

18    (I) [WHERE THE EQUALIZED MILLAGE IS THIRTY PERCENT (30%) OR  
19    MORE ABOVE THE MEDIAN EQUALIZED MILLAGE, ROUNDED TO A WHOLE  
20    MILL, THE AMOUNT SHALL BE THE MEDIAN ACTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPENSE  
21    PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP ROUNDED TO THE NEAREST TEN  
22    DOLLARS (\$10) AMOUNT.

23    (II) WHERE THE EQUALIZED MILLAGE IS FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) OR  
24    MORE AND LESS THAN THIRTY PERCENT (30%) ABOVE THE MEDIAN  
25    EQUALIZED MILLAGE, ROUNDED TO A WHOLE MILL, THE AMOUNT SHALL BE  
26    FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50) LESS THAN THE MEDIAN ACTUAL INSTRUCTION  
27    EXPENSE PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

28    (III) WHERE THE EQUALIZED MILLAGE IS LESS THAN FIFTEEN  
29    PERCENT (15%) ABOVE OR BELOW THE MEDIAN EQUALIZED MILLAGE,  
30    ROUNDED TO A WHOLE MILL, THE AMOUNT SHALL BE ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS

1 (\$100) LESS THAN THE MEDIAN ACTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPENSE PER  
2 WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

3 (IV) WHERE THE EQUALIZED MILLAGE IS FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) TO  
4 THIRTY PERCENT (30%) BELOW THE MEDIAN EQUALIZED MILLAGE, ROUNDED  
5 TO A WHOLE MILL, THE AMOUNT SHALL BE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS  
6 (\$150) LESS THAN THE MEDIAN ACTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPENSE PER  
7 WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.

8 (V) WHERE THE EQUALIZED MILLAGE IS MORE THAN THIRTY PERCENT  
9 (30%) BELOW THE MEDIAN EQUALIZED MILLAGE, THE AMOUNT SHALL BE  
10 TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200) LESS THAN THE MEDIAN ACTUAL  
11 INSTRUCTION EXPENSE PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP.]  
12 SUBTRACT THE INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT'S EQUALIZED MILLAGE FROM  
13 THE HIGHEST EQUALIZED MILLAGE IN THE STATE.

14 (II) DIVIDE THE AMOUNT DETERMINED IN SUBCLAUSE (I) BY THE  
15 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE HIGHEST AND LOWEST EQUALIZED MILLAGE IN  
16 THE STATE.

17 (III) MULTIPLY THE QUOTIENT DETERMINED IN SUBCLAUSE (II) BY  
18 TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200) AND ROUND TO THE NEAREST WHOLE DOLLAR  
19 AMOUNT.

20 (IV) SUBTRACT THE AMOUNT DETERMINED IN SUBCLAUSE (III) FROM  
21 THE MEDIAN ACTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPENSE PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY  
22 MEMBERSHIP IN THE YEAR FOR WHICH REIMBURSEMENT IS BEING  
23 COMPUTED.

24 SECTION 3. SUBSECTION (F) OF SECTION 2502 OF THE ACT,  
25 AMENDED AUGUST 24, 1977 (P.L.199, NO.59), IS AMENDED AND A  
26 SUBSECTION IS ADDED TO READ:

27 SECTION 2502. PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF INSTRUCTION.--\* \* \*

28 (F) FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR COMMENCING THE FIRST DAY OF JULY  
29 WITHIN THE YEAR OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS AMENDMENT, AND  
30 EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SO ENTITLED

1 SHALL BE PAID, IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER SUBSIDY TO WHICH IT IS  
2 ENTITLED, AN AMOUNT FOR DENSITY OR SPARSITY OF POPULATION.  
3 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN CLAUSE (17) OF SECTION 2501 AND AS  
4 PROVIDED BELOW, THIS AMOUNT SHALL BE PAID ON ACCOUNT OF  
5 EXPENDITURES IN EXCESS OF FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$400) PER  
6 WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP, NOT TO EXCEED FOR THE SCHOOL  
7 YEAR 1966-1967 ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100), FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR  
8 1967-1968 ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$150), FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR  
9 1968-1969 TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200), FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 1969-  
10 1970 AND EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS  
11 (\$250), AN AMOUNT TO BE DETERMINED BY MULTIPLYING THE EXCESS  
12 EXPENDITURES BY THE MARKET VALUE/INCOME AID RATIO OR BY THREE  
13 HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSANDTHS (.375) WHICHEVER IS GREATER,  
14 AND BY THE NUMBER OF WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP, SUCH  
15 AMOUNT TO BE IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PAYMENT FOR SUCH PUPILS:  
16 PROVIDED, HOWEVER, A SCHOOL DISTRICT ENTITLED TO ADDITIONAL  
17 PAYMENT FOR DENSITY OR SPARSITY OF POPULATION MAY, IN LIEU OF  
18 THE ABOVE PAYMENT, ELECT FOR ANY SCHOOL YEAR TO BE PAID AND THE  
19 COMMONWEALTH SHALL PAY SUCH ADDITIONAL ENTITLEMENT ON ACCOUNT OF  
20 EXCESS EXPENDITURES PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP IN  
21 EXCESS OF FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$400) A SUM OF THIRTY DOLLARS  
22 (\$30) PER WEIGHTED AVERAGE DAILY MEMBERSHIP, SUCH AMOUNT TO BE  
23 IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PAYMENTS FOR SUCH PUPILS.

24 [THE PAYMENT FOR THE DENSITY FACTOR FOR THOSE QUALIFYING  
25 SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH A WADM IN EXCESS OF FIFTY THOUSAND  
26 (50,000) SHALL BE THE ACTUAL COST OF INSTRUCTION PER WADM  
27 MULTIPLIED BY FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) THROUGH THE 1969-1970 SCHOOL  
28 YEAR OR BY NINETEEN PERCENT (19%) FOR THE 1970-1971 SCHOOL YEAR  
29 THROUGH THE 1975-1976 SCHOOL YEAR OR BY TWENTY-THREE PERCENT  
30 (23%) FOR THE 1976-1977 SCHOOL YEAR AND THEREAFTER AND BY THE



WADM OF THE DISTRICT.]

(F.1) THE PAYMENT FOR THE DENSITY FACTOR FOR THOSE QUALIFYING SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH A WADM IN EXCESS OF THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND (35,000) SHALL BE THE ACTUAL COST OF INSTRUCTION PER WADM MULTIPLIED BY FIFTEEN PERCENT (15%) THROUGH THE 1969-1970 SCHOOL YEAR OR BY NINETEEN PERCENT (19%) FOR THE 1970-1971 SCHOOL YEAR THROUGH THE 1975-1976 SCHOOL YEAR OF BY TWENTY-THREE PERCENT (23%) FOR THE 1976-1977 SCHOOL YEAR THROUGH THE 1977-1978 SCHOOL YEAR AND BY TWENTY-ONE PERCENT (21%) FOR THE 1978-1979 SCHOOL YEAR AND THEREAFTER AND BY THE WADM OF THE DISTRICT. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 2502.6 THE ENTITLEMENT PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE PAID IN FULL FOR EACH SCHOOL YEAR.

SECTION 4. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING SECTIONS TO READ:

SECTION 2502.6. PROPORTIONATE REDUCTION OF PAYMENTS.--IF THE SUMS APPROPRIATED FOR THE 1978-1979 SCHOOL YEAR AND EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER ARE NOT SUFFICIENT TO PAY IN FULL THE TOTAL AMOUNTS TO WHICH ALL QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICTS, INTERMEDIATE UNITS AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS 917.1-A, 919.1-A, 922.1-A, 923-A(D), 2501, 2502, 2502.3 AND 2502.4 FOR SUCH YEAR, THE ALLOCATIONS TO THE SCHOOLS DISTRICTS, INTERMEDIATE UNITS AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS SHALL BE PROPORTIONATELY REDUCED TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY TO BRING THE AGGREGATE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, INTERMEDIATE UNIT AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOL ALLOCATIONS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED. HOWEVER, NO SCHOOL DISTRICT'S GROSS ALLOCATION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE SECTIONS REFERRED TO HEREIN SHALL BE LESS FOR THE 1978-1979 OR THE 1979-1980 SCHOOL YEAR THAN ITS GROSS ALLOCATION UNDER SUCH SECTIONS FOR THE

1 PREVIOUS SCHOOL YEAR.

2 SECTION 2502.7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.--FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS  
3 ACT IT IS THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE THAT THE TOTAL  
4 APPROPRIATION FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF  
5 SECTIONS 917.1-A, 919.1-A, 922.1-A, 923-A(D), 2501, 2502, 2502.3  
6 AND 2502.4 SHALL BE INCREASED BY A MINIMUM OF SEVEN PERCENT (7%)  
7 OVER THE PRIOR YEAR'S TOTAL APPROPRIATION UNDER THESE SECTIONS  
8 FOR THE 1979-1980 SCHOOL YEAR AND EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER  
9 UNTIL THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT ARE FULLY FUNDED.

14 SECTION 2505.1. STATE REIMBURSEMENT FOR HEALTH SERVICES.--  
15 (A) EVERY SCHOOL DISTRICT AND JOINT SCHOOL BOARD WHICH RENDERS  
16 HEALTH SERVICES TO CHILDREN OF SCHOOL AGE SHALL BE REIMBURSED BY  
17 THE COMMONWEALTH ON ACCOUNT OF HEALTH SERVICES WHICH CONFORM TO  
18 STANDARDS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH. REIMBURSEMENTS  
19 SHALL BE PAID BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH. THE AMOUNT THEREOF  
20 SHALL BE THE ACTUAL COST OF THE MEDICAL AND DENTAL SERVICES AND  
21 SCHOOL NURSE SERVICES AS CERTIFIED TO THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH,  
22 LESS ANY CHARGES DEEMED UNREASONABLE BY HIM, BUT FOR MEDICAL  
23 SERVICES SHALL NOT FOR ANY SCHOOL YEAR EXCEED THE SUM OF (1)  
24 [EIGHTY CENTS (\$.80)] ONE DOLLAR AND SIXTY CENTS (\$1.60)  
25 MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN ENROLLED IN A SCHOOL FOR  
26 THE ENTIRE SCHOOL TERM OF THAT SCHOOL YEAR AND FOR WHOM THE  
27 SCHOOL DISTRICT OR JOINT SCHOOL BOARD MAINTAINS COMPREHENSIVE  
28 HEALTH RECORDS AS DEFINED IN SECTION 1402, AND (2) A  
29 PROPORTIONATE PART OF [EIGHTY CENTS (\$.80) ONE DOLLAR AND SIXTY  
30 CENTS (\$1.60) FOR EACH CHILD ENROLLED FOR A PART OF THE SCHOOL

1 TERM OF THAT SCHOOL YEAR AND FOR WHOM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR  
2 JOINT SCHOOL BOARD MAINTAINS A COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH RECORD AS  
3 DEFINED IN SECTION 1402, FOR DENTAL SERVICES SHALL NOT FOR ANY  
4 SCHOOL YEAR EXCEED THE SUM OF (1) [FORTY CENTS (\$.40)] EIGHTY  
5 CENTS (\$.80) MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN ENROLLED IN A  
6 SCHOOL FOR THE ENTIRE SCHOOL TERM OF THAT SCHOOL YEAR AND FOR  
7 WHOM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR JOINT SCHOOL BOARD MAINTAINS  
8 COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH RECORDS AS DEFINED IN SECTION 1402, AND (2)  
9 A PROPORTIONATE PART OF [FORTY CENTS (\$.40)] EIGHTY CENTS (\$.80)  
10 FOR EACH CHILD ENROLLED FOR A PART OF THE SCHOOL TERM OF THAT  
11 SCHOOL YEAR AND FOR WHOM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR JOINT SCHOOL  
12 BOARD MAINTAINS A COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH RECORD AS DEFINED IN  
13 SECTION 1402, AND FOR SCHOOL NURSE SERVICES SHALL NOT FOR ANY  
14 SCHOOL YEAR EXCEED THE SUM OF (1) [THREE DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS  
15 (\$3.50)] SEVEN DOLLARS (\$7.00) MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF  
16 CHILDREN ENROLLED IN A SCHOOL FOR THE ENTIRE SCHOOL TERM OF THAT  
17 SCHOOL YEAR, AND (2) A PROPORTIONATE PART OF [THREE DOLLARS AND  
18 FIFTY CENTS (\$3.50)] SEVEN DOLLARS (\$7.00) FOR EACH CHILD  
19 ENROLLED FOR A PART OF THE SCHOOL TERM OF THAT SCHOOL YEAR.

20 (A.1) EVERY SCHOOL DISTRICT OR JOINT SCHOOL BOARD WHICH  
21 EMPLOYS ONE OR MORE DENTAL HYGIENISTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF DENTAL  
22 HYGIENE SERVICES TO CHILDREN OF SCHOOL AGE SHALL BE REIMBURSED  
23 BY THE COMMONWEALTH ON ACCOUNT OF SUCH SERVICES WHICH CONFORM TO  
24 STANDARDS APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH. REIMBURSEMENT  
25 SHALL BE MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH. THE AMOUNT THEREOF  
26 SHALL BE THE ACTUAL COST OF THE DENTAL HYGIENE SERVICES AS  
27 CERTIFIED TO THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH, LESS ANY CHARGES THAT  
28 SHALL BE DEEMED UNREASONABLE BY HIM, BUT FOR ANY SCHOOL YEAR  
29 SHALL NOT EXCEED THE SUM OF [ONE DOLLAR (\$1)] TWO DOLLARS (\$2)  
30 MULTIPLIED BY THE ACTUAL NUMBER OF CHILDREN ENROLLED IN THE

1 SCHOOL FOR THE ENTIRE SCHOOL TERM WHO RECEIVE SUCH DENTAL  
2 HYGIENE SERVICES, AND A PROPORTIONATE PART OF [ONE DOLLAR (\$1)]  
3 TWO DOLLARS (\$2) FOR EACH CHILD ENROLLED FOR A PART OF THE  
4 SCHOOL TERM OF THAT SCHOOL YEAR AND WHO ACTUALLY RECEIVES DENTAL  
5 HYGIENE SERVICES. REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE  
6 IN LIEU OF ANY REIMBURSEMENT PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS  
7 SECTION FOR DENTAL SERVICES.

9 SECTION 6. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:

10 SECTION 2509.3. PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF TRANSPORTATION OF  
11 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS.--EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, REGARDLESS OF  
12 CLASSIFICATION, SHALL BE PAID BY THE COMMONWEALTH THE SUM OF  
13 TWENTY DOLLARS (\$20) FOR EACH NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPIL TRANSPORTED  
14 IN THE SCHOOL YEAR 1978-1979 AND EACH SCHOOL YEAR THEREAFTER.

15 SECTION 7. SECTION 16, ACT OF AUGUST 24, 1977 (P.L.199,  
16 NO.59), ENTITLED "AN ACT AMENDING THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949  
17 (P.L.30, NO.14), ENTITLED 'AN ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL  
18 SYSTEM, INCLUDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS APPLICABLE AS WELL TO  
19 PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS; AMENDING, REVISING, CONSOLIDATING  
20 AND CHANGING THE LAWS RELATING THERETO,' CHANGING AND ADDING  
21 DEFINITIONS; FURTHER PROVIDING FOR SUBSIDIES, INSTRUCTIONAL  
22 MATERIALS, TEXTBOOKS AND MODIFIED SPARSITY PAYMENTS; PROVIDING  
23 FOR CLASSES AND PROGRAMS FOR CERTAIN EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN; AND  
24 FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFACING, INJURING OR DESTROYING SCHOOL  
25 PROPERTY," IS REPEALED.

26 SECTION 8. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT JULY 1, 1979  
27 REGARDLESS OF THE DATE OF FINAL ENACTMENT.
