## AN ACT

- Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581),
  entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending
  and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," increasing
  the permissible level of contributions to be made to county
  and regional borough associations.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
  hereby enacts as follows:

  Section 1. Section 702, act of February 1, 1966 (1965)

- 9 P.L.1656, No.581), known as "The Borough Code," is amended to

- 11 Section 702. County and Regional Associations of Boroughs.--
- 12 The boroughs of any county or of two or more adjoining or nearby
- 13 counties, may organize a county or regional association of
- 14 boroughs, composed of elected and appointed borough officials in
- 15 such county or counties, organized for the purpose of furthering
- 16 the interests of the boroughs in the association and their
- 17 inhabitants. Any borough may annually appropriate a sum of
- 18 money, not exceeding [seventy-five dollars (\$75)] one hundred
- 19 <u>fifty dollars (\$150)</u> for the support of such association, and

- 1 may also appropriate and expend borough moneys to pay the actual
- 2 expenses of officials of the borough in attending meetings of
- 3 the county or regional association of which such borough is a
- 4 member. Any such county or regional association of boroughs
- 5 shall have the option of admitting to membership representatives
- 6 of political subdivisions other than boroughs within such county
- 7 or counties but representatives of such other political
- 8 subdivisions shall have no voice or vote in any matter that is
- 9 or may be of concern solely to boroughs.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
