AN ACT

8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 1511, act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
10	No.14), known as the "Public School Code of 1949," amended July
11	31, 1968 (P.L.1020, No.301), is amended to read:
12	Section 1511. Subjects of Instruction; Flag CodeIn every
13	elementary public and private school, established and maintained
14	in this Commonwealth, the following subjects shall be taught, in
15	the English language and from English texts: English, including
16	spelling, reading and writing, arithmetic, geography, the
17	history of the United States and of Pennsylvania, civics,
18	including loyalty to the State and National Government, safety
19	education, and the humane treatment of birds and animals,

health, including <u>cardiopulmonary resuscitation according to</u> 1 certified American Heart Association standards and American Red 2 3 Cross standards and taught by certified instructors, physical 4 education, and physiology, music and art. Other subjects shall be taught in the public elementary schools and also in the 5 public high schools as may be prescribed by the standards of the 6 State Board of Education. All such subjects, except foreign 7 8 languages, shall be taught in the English language and from English texts: Provided, however, That, at the discretion of the 9 10 [Superintendent of Public Instruction] Secretary of Education, 11 the teaching of subjects in a language other than English may be permitted as part of a sequence in foreign language study or as 12 13 part of a bilingual education program if the teaching personnel are properly certified in the subject fields. Each school 14 15 district shall provide and distribute to each pupil, enrolled in 16 the eighth grade of the public schools, one illustrated copy of 17 the National Flag Code, and shall, from time to time, make 18 available such copies as are necessary for replacements from 19 year to year. It shall be the duty of each teacher in the public 20 schools to make such use of the code as may, from time to time, 21 seem proper.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
