AS AMENDED ON THIRD CONSIDERATION, HOUSE OF
REPRESENTATIVES, MAY 24, 1979

AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 1, 1978 (No.56A), entitled "An act
2 appropriating the Federal augmentation to the Executive and
3 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and establishing
4 restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1,
5 1978 to June 30, 1979 and for the payment of bills incurred
6 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending
7 June 30, 1978," changing and adding appropriations.

8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9 hereby enacts as follows:

10 Section 1. Sections 2 and 3, subsection (a) of sections 4, 5
11 and 6, act of July 1, 1978 (No.56A), known as the "Federal
12 Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1978," amended September 27,
13 1978 (No.61A), are amended by changing and adding items to read:

14 Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
15 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal
16 augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of
17 the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for
