AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated  
2 Statutes, providing an additional exemption from registration  
3 fees.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1901(b) of Title 75, act of November 25,  
7 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated  
8 Statutes, is amended to read:

9 § 1901. Exemption of entities and vehicles from fees.

11 (b) Title and registration fees.--

12 (1) No fee shall be charged for titling or registration  
13 of any of the following:

14 [(1)] (i) Buses registered by urban mass  
15 transportation systems except that this [paragraph]  
16 subparagraph shall cover only the number of buses which  
17 the department determines are required to provide  
18 scheduled service within the county in which they have

1           their principal place of business or contiguous counties.

2           [(2)] (ii) Vehicles registered by volunteer fire,  
3           rescue and ambulance associations.

4           [(3)] (iii) Vehicles registered by foreign nationals  
5           with the rank of vice consul or higher assigned to a  
6           consulate in this Commonwealth provided that citizens of  
7           the United States are granted reciprocal exemptions.

8           [(4)] (iv) Vehicles of totally disabled veterans  
9           whose disability is certified by the United States  
10          Veterans' Administration as service-connected.

11          (2) No fee shall be charged for registration of buses  
12          operated by a common carrier of passengers which is subject  
13          to the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Public Utility  
14          Commission.

16          Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
