INTRODUCED BY CALTAGIRONE, COCHRAN AND LEHR, JANUARY 26, 1981

AS REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE ON LIQUOR CONTROL, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AS AMENDED, APRIL 1, 1981

## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," providing for the stocking and sale of miniature bottles of liquor at Pennsylvania liquor stores.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 305, act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the "Liquor Code," is amended by adding a subsection to read:

Section 305. Sales by Pennsylvania Liquor Stores.--* * * (a.1) Every Pennsylvania Liquor Store THE PENNSYLVANIA

1 LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD shall keep in stock for sale in packages of 2 multiple quantities miniature bottles consisting of one ounce, <-

5 VARIETIES AND BRANDS OF LIQUOR AS THE BOARD SHALL PRESCRIBE.
6 SUCH MINIATURE BOTTLES SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC
7 IN QUANTITIES LESS THAN CASE LOT.
8 * * *
9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
