AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled  
2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the  
3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the  
4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative  
5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,  
6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or  
7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or  
8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative  
9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and  
10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative  
11 officers, and of the several administrative departments,  
12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the  
13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive  
14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of  
15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and  
16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,  
17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the  
18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other  
19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and  
20 commissions shall be determined," empowering the Executive  
21 Board to set the salaries of the chairman and members of the  
22 Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole and making  
23 repeals.

24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
25 hereby enacts as follows:

26 Section 1. Section 709, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,  
27 No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," is amended  
28 by adding a clause to read:

1       Section 709. Executive Board.--Subject to the provisions of  
2 this act, the Executive Board shall have the power:

3       \* \* \*

4       (m) In addition to those powers otherwise provided by law,  
5 to determine the salaries of the chairman and the members of the  
6 following independent and departmental administrative boards:

7       (1) The Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.

8       Section 2. The following parts of acts are repealed insofar  
9 as they are inconsistent herewith:

10      Section 5, act of August 6, 1941 (P.L.861, No.323), entitled,  
11 as amended, "An act to create a uniform and exclusive system for  
12 the administration of parole in this Commonwealth; providing  
13 state probation services; establishing the 'Pennsylvania Board  
14 of Probation and Parole'; conferring and defining its  
15 jurisdiction, duties, powers and functions; including the  
16 supervision of persons placed upon probation and parole in  
17 certain designated cases; providing for the method of  
18 appointment of its members; regulating the appointment, removal  
19 and discharge of its officers, clerks and employees; dividing the  
20 Commonwealth into administrative districts for purposes of  
21 probation and parole; fixing the salaries of members of the  
22 board and of certain other officers and employees thereof; making  
23 violations of certain provisions of this act misdemeanors;  
24 providing penalties therefor; and for other cognate purposes,  
25 and making an appropriation."

26      As much as relates to the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and  
27 Parole of section 1, act of September 2, 1961 (P.L.1177,  
28 No.525), entitled "An act fixing the salaries and compensation  
29 of members of certain boards and commissions, and repealing  
30 inconsistent acts."

1       Section 3.   This act shall take effect in 60 days.
