AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), entitled "An 2 act providing for the planning and regulation of solid waste 3 storage, collection, transportation, processing, treatment, and disposal; requiring municipalities to submit plans for municipal waste management systems in their jurisdictions; 5 authorizing grants to municipalities; providing regulation of 7 the management of municipal, residual and hazardous waste; requiring permits for operating hazardous waste and solid 8 9 waste storage, processing, treatment, and disposal 10 facilities; and licenses for transportation of hazardous waste; imposing duties on persons and municipalities; 11 granting powers to municipalities; authorizing the 12 Environmental Quality Board and the Department of 13 14 Environmental Resources to adopt rules, regulations, 15 standards and procedures; granting powers to and imposing duties upon county health departments; providing remedies; 16 prescribing penalties; and establishing a fund, requiring 17 18 approval of the governing body for a permit or license for the disposal of hazardous waste. 19 20 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 21 22 Section 1. Section 504, act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, 23 No.97), known as the "Solid Waste Management Act," is amended to

26 [Applications for a permit shall be reviewed by the

- 1 appropriate county, county planning agency or county health
- 2 department where they exist and the host municipality, and they
- 3 may recommend to the department conditions upon, revisions to,
- 4 or disapproval of the permit only if specific cause is
- 5 identified. In such case the department shall be required to
- 6 publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin its justification for
- 7 overriding the county's recommendations. If the department does
- 8 not receive comments within 60 days, the county shall be deemed
- 9 to have waived its right to review.]
- No permit or license for the disposal of hazardous waste
- 11 shall be granted without the written consent or approval of the
- 12 governing body of the county in which the proposed disposal site
- 13 <u>is located.</u>
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
