## HOUSE RESOLUTION No. 6 Session of 1981

INTRODUCED BY J. L. WRIGHT, BURNS, SEVENTY, STAIRS, W. D. HUTCHINSON, TELEK, CLYMER AND ITKIN, JANUARY 27, 1981

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL-STATE RELATIONS, JANUARY 27, 1981

In the House of Representatives, January 27, 1981 WHEREAS, The development of nuclear power has been an accepted alternate method of meeting a part of our Nation's energy requirements; and

WHEREAS, The Three Mile Island nuclear power plant was planned, designed, built, operated and regulated almost exclusively by various agencies of the Federal Government, including its Atomic Energy Commission, Energy Research and Development Administration, Federal Energy Administration, Federal Power Commission, Department of Energy and Nuclear Regulatory Commission; and

WHEREAS, An accident on March 28, 1979, at the Three Mile Island facility caused the shutdown of the facility and the necessity of purchasing large amounts of replacement energy for the people formerly served by the facility; and WHEREAS, The costs attendant with the accident and repair of

16 the facility and replacement of fuel promises to be many

1 millions of dollars; and

2 WHEREAS: The potential environmental consequences and costs3 of the accident are yet unknown; and

4 WHEREAS, The owners and consumers of the Three Mile Island 5 facility are not able to assume such costs by themselves without 6 causing severe economic disaster and dislocation to themselves 7 and the Commonwealth; and

8 WHEREAS, It is in the Nation's interest to ensure the 9 equitable distribution of the risks attendant with the 10 development of nuclear power particularly since the burden of 11 the costs of the accident, including cleanup and fuel 12 replacement costs, pose serious economic consequences for the 13 Commonwealth; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED (the Senate of Pennsylvania concurring), That 15 whereas the Federal Government has accepted the major 16 responsibility for encouraging the creation and development of 17 the nuclear power industry, the Federal Government, then, should 18 be responsible for carrying the major share of the costs 19 relating to the Three Mile Island accident; and be it further 20 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly respectfully petitions 21 Congress to appropriate Federal impact aid to pay for 22 replacement fuel costs due to the shutdown of the Three Mile Island plant and for the cleanup and repair of the damaged 23 24 facility; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to 26 the President, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and 27 the President of the Senate and the appropriate committee 28 chairmen in the House and Senate of the United States Congress.
