- 1 WHEREAS, The gardners of Pennsylvania produce a multitude of
- 2 foods for its people and contributes to enable the Nation to
- 3 export foods to other countries which are in desperate need of
- 4 food; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Gardens also yield flowers of great variety and
- 6 breathtaking beauty; and
- WHEREAS, Gardening is a pleasant and productive full or part-
- 8 time activity for a large number of citizens; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's gardeners help to preserve and foster
- 10 the traditional American spirit of independence and individual
- 11 initiative; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Gardening instills in all Pennsylvanians and
- 13 Americans a great appreciation for nature and the beauty of this
- 14 State and country, an appreciation which fosters respect and
- 15 care for the environment; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), By the House of

- 1 Representatives of Pennsylvania, that the week beginning the
- 2 first Sunday of June of each year, commencing with the week of
- 3 June 6, 1982, is designated as "Pennsylvania Garden Week" and
- 4 the Governor is requested to issue a proclamation urging State
- 5 and local government agencies, and citizens and private
- 6 organizations, to observe such week with appropriate ceremonies
- 7 and other activities, including the wearing of garden flowers as
- 8 a symbol of appreciation for the efforts and contributions of
- 9 the State and Nation's gardeners; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 11 each House of the Congress of the United States.
