## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), entitled "A supplement to the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 2 3 entitled 'An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 6 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 7 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 8 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 9 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 10 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 12 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 13 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 14 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 15 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 16 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 17 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 18 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 21 commissions shall be determined, 'implementing the addition 22 of section 4.1 to Article IV of the Constitution of 23 Pennsylvania; establishing the Office of Attorney General 24 elected by the citizens and setting forth powers and duties 25 of the Attorney General; creating an Office of General Counsel and providing for legal services for Commonwealth 26 27 agencies; transferring, reorganizing or reconstituting 28 certain boards, commissions and agencies; placing certain 29 duties upon the courts and district attorneys; repealing 30 certain acts and parts of acts and making appropriations," 31 imposing powers and duties on the Office of Attorney General 32 relating to supervision and administration of the 33 Pennsylvania Crime Commission.

- 1 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 2 hereby enacts as follows:
- 3 Section 1. Sections 201 and 206 of the act of October 15,
- 4 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act,
- 5 are amended to read:
- 6 Section 201. Established as an independent department.
- 7 (a) General provisions. -- The Office of Attorney General
- 8 shall be an independent department and shall be headed by the
- 9 Attorney General. The Attorney General shall exercise such
- 10 powers and perform such duties as are hereinafter set forth. As
- 11 an independent administrative department the Office of Attorney
- 12 General shall be subject to the same limitations contained in
- 13 the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The
- 14 Administrative Code of 1929," and all other acts as are
- 15 applicable to the independent Department of Auditor General or
- 16 State Treasury.
- 17 (b) Consumer Advocate. -- The Attorney General shall appoint a
- 18 Consumer Advocate which appointment shall be subject to the
- 19 approval of a majority of the members elected to the Senate. The
- 20 Consumer Advocate shall perform the duties and have the powers
- 21 set forth in Article IX-A of "The Administrative Code of 1929."
- 22 (c) Bureaus, divisions and personnel.--The Attorney General
- 23 shall appoint and fix the compensation of a first deputy
- 24 attorney general, a director of the Bureau of Consumer
- 25 Protection and such other deputies, officers and employees who
- 26 may, at any time, exercise such powers and perform such duties
- 27 as may be prescribed by the Attorney General. The Attorney
- 28 General may establish such bureaus or divisions as may be
- 29 required for the proper conduct of the office, including a
- 30 criminal investigation bureau.

- 1 (d) Pennsylvania Crime Commission. -- The Attorney General
- 2 shall appoint and fix the compensation of an executive director
- 3 of the Pennsylvania Crime Commission and such other officers and
- 4 employees as the commission may require for the proper conduct
- 5 of the commission.
- 6 Section 206. Law enforcement and criminal investigations;
- 7 investigating grand juries.
- 8 (a) Law enforcement; criminal investigations. -- The Attorney
- 9 General shall be the chief law enforcement officer of the
- 10 Commonwealth; the district attorney shall be the chief law
- 11 enforcement officer for the county in which he is elected. The
- 12 Attorney General shall have the power to investigate any
- 13 criminal offense which he has the power to prosecute under
- 14 section 205; he shall continue the existing programs relating to
- 15 drug law enforcement. The Pennsylvania State Police shall
- 16 cooperate with the Attorney General and furnish such services as
- 17 the Attorney General shall request.
- 18 (b) Investigating grand juries. -- The Attorney General shall
- 19 convene and conduct investigating grand juries as provided in
- 20 the act of November 22, 1978 (P.L.1148, No.271), known as the
- 21 "Investigating Grand Jury Act."
- 22 (c) Pennsylvania Crime Commission. -- The Attorney General
- 23 shall administer and supervise the activities of the
- 24 Pennsylvania Crime Commission as set forth in the act of October
- 25 <u>4, 1978 (P.L.876, No.169), known as the "Pennsylvania Crime</u>
- 26 <u>Commission Act."</u>
- 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
